In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0016, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act amending 18-7-107, MCA, to require all printing, binding, and stationery work for the state agencies be printed in the State of Montana by the lowest responsible bidder.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- Quantity of printing jobs will remain the same in FY92 and in FY93 as in FY90. The projected quantities do not include printing procurement by the Legislative Council.
- The current printing capabilities of in-state printing firms will remain unchanged in FY92-93.
- Approximately 40% of the printing jobs in FY90 were awarded to out-of-state firms.
- The differences in prices between in-state and out-of-state firms will remain unchanged. A random sampling of purchase orders issued to out-of-state printers indicated the average cost to be 29.7% lower than the lowest responsible bid from an in-state vendor.
- Current law operating expenses are the executive budget recommendation for the Procurement and Printing Division of the Department of Administration.


LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

IF THERE IS NO RESPONSIBLE IN-STATE BIDDER, THE WORK MAY BE PERFORMED BY THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE BIDDER OUTSIDE THE STATE. FEDERAL EXEMPTIONS AS SPECIFIED IN 18-1-102(2)(B) APPLY."
