In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0071, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act requiring sentencing courts to determine if inmates incarcerated in local detention centers have the ability to pay incarceration costs; requiring sentencing courts to order financially able inmates to pay for the cost of their incarceration; providing that the funds collected from inmates be used to reimburse the governmental entities liable for the incarceration costs of inmates.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Costs related to investigating financial status of individuals and collecting reimbursement monies are absorbed at the local level.
- 2. Average Daily Population of individuals incarcerated in local detention centers is 633 (Source: Survey conducted by Legislative Council March, 1990).
- 3. Average daily cost of local incarceration per individual is \$27.50. (Source: Survey by Legislative Council, March 1990)
- 4. Total annual costs of local incarceration are approximately \$6,353,737 (633 x \$27.50 x 365).
- 4. Two state agencies (Department of Institutions and Department of Justice, Highway Patrol) are liable for incarceration costs of about 12% of the average daily population. (In FY90, Institutions paid \$414,365 and Highway Patrol paid \$320,000. (Source: agency fiscal officers.)
- 5. It is assumed that 20% of total costs will be recovered from incarcerated individuals and reimbursed to counties, state agencies (Dept. of Justice, Hwy Patrol, Institutions) or federal agencies.
- 6. Based on assumptions outlined above, the gross amount of approximately \$152,489 (12% x 20% x \$6,353,738)) will be reimbursed annually to the two state agencies liable for the incarceration costs of the inmate.
