8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
9	Section 1. Section 13-37-216, MCA, is amended to read:
10	"13-37-216. Limitations on contributions. (1) Aggregate
11	contributions for all elections in a campaign by an
12	individual, other than the candidate, to a candidate and
13	political committees organized on his behalf are limited as
14	follows:
15	(a) for candidates filed jointly for the office of
16	governor and lieutenant governor, not to exceed \$1,500;
17	(b) for a candidate to be elected for state office in a
18	statewide election, other than the candidates for governor
19	and lieutenant governor, not to exceed \$750;
20	(c) for a candidate for public service commissioner,
21	district court judge, or state senator, not to exceed \$400;
22	and
23	(d) for a candidate for any other public office, not to
24	exceed \$250.
25	(2) For the purposes of this subsection, an independent

 - (3) In a year in which an election is held for the Montana house of representatives and senate, unless special circumstances such as a physical disability of a candidate

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1	are present, a candidate is encouraged to voluntarily agree
2	with other candidates for that office that expenditures will
3	not be made for the general election by the candidate, by
4	the principal campaign committee of the candidate, or
5	otherwise on behalf of the candidate that result in an
6	aggregate amount in excess of \$10,000 for a senate election
7	and \$5,000 for a house election. Prior to the 1992 primary
8	election and prior to each succeeding primary election, the
9	commissioner of political practices shall multiply the
0	amounts contained in this subsection by the consumer price
1	index as determined by the bureau of labor statistics of the
2	United States department of labor statistics for each
3	calendar year since 1990 and shall publish the new voluntary
4	limitations as a rule.
5	(3)(4) The mandatory limitations imposed by this
6	section do not apply to public funds contributed to a
7	candidate under part 3 of this chapter."
