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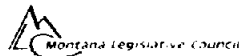

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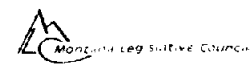

WHEREAS, American Indians account for approximately 6% of Montana's population; and

WHEREAS, less than 3% of the enrollment in the Montana University System is American Indian; and

WHEREAS, by the year 2000, a high school diploma will provide an opening to only 49% of available jobs; and

WHEREAS, between the present and the year 2000, one-third of the new jobs created will be filled by college graduates; and

WHEREAS, Montana's economic future depends upon a well-educated work force.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Appropriation. There is appropriated to the commissioner of higher education from the general fund \$175,648 for the biennium ending June 30, 1993, to support the staff and operation of the director of

American Indian/minority achievement.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Purpose of appropriation.

(1) The director of American Indian/minority achievement shall use the money appropriated in [section 1] to improve the recruitment and retention of American Indians in higher education by:

(A) continuing the data collection and analysis begun by the Montana tracks project;

(B) serving as a consultant to the Montana university system campuses and vocational-technical centers on the development of plans for recruitment and retention; and

(C) serving as a liaison between the university system, tribal governments, and tribal colleges.

(2) THE DIRECTOR SHALL PROVIDE A REPORT TO THE 53RD LEGISLATURE ON THE ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF AND DATA GATHERED BY THE PROGRAM DURING THE 1993 BIENNIUM.
