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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 61-8-349, MCA, is amended to read:

"61-8-349. Certain vehicles to stop at all railroad grade crossings. (1) All-persons A person driving a motor vehicles vehicle upon the a public highways highway of this state outside of corporate limits of incorporated cities or towns where the view is obscure or when a moving train is within sight or hearing shall bring said the vehicle to a full stop not less than 10 or more than 100 feet from where said the intersection of the highway intersects and the railroad tracks within-this-state, before crossing the same railroad tracks, at all crossings where a flagman or a mechanical device is not maintained to warn the traveling public of approaching trains or cars.
