

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9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 Section 1. Section 20-7-117, MCA, is amended to read: "20-7-117. Five-year-old schooling and 11 preschool programs. (1) The trustees of an elementary district may 12 13 shall establish or make available a program capable of accommodating, at a minimum, all the children in the 14 15 district who will be 5 years old on or before September 10 16 of the school year for which the program is to be conducted or who have been enrolled by special permission of the board 17 18 of trustees. The program shall must be an integral part of 19 the elementary school and shall must be financed and 20 governed accordingly, provided that to be eligible for 21 inclusion in the calculation of ANB pursuant to 20-9-311, a 22 child must have reached the age of 5 on or before September 10 of the school year covered by the calculation or have 23 been enrolled by special permission of the board of 24 25 trustees.



1 (2) The trustees of an elementary school district may 2 establish and operate a free preschool program for children between the ages of 3 and 5 years. When such preschool 3 programs are established, they shall must be an integral 4 part of the elementary school and shall must be governed 5 accordingly. Financing of preschool programs shall may not 6 7 be supported by moneys money available from state equalization aid." 8

# STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

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In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0175, as introduced.

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to provide that the trustees of an elementary school district shall establish or make available a kindergarten program in the district; and amending section 20-7-117. MCA.

#### **ASSUMPTIONS:**

- 1. Current legislation allowing districts to offer kindergarten creates a current state liability to fund all kindergarten programs. This bill does not increase the current liability. Parents will still have the option of sending or not sending their children to kindergarten. However the school district will be required to provide a kindergarten under this proposed bill.
- 2. Districts which offer kindergarten have approximately 94% ratio of K to 1st grade due to a declining entering population and the non-enrollment of some students.
- 20-9-161, MCA. through 20-9-167, MCA., allows for emergency budgeting procedures for impacted school districts having 3. unanticipated increases in enrollment causing shortfalls in their current fiscal year adopted operating budgets.
- Approximately 30 districts (8%) of the elementary districts do not offer kindergarten programs. In the past 2 years 4. seven districts received approval to begin operating a kindergarten program. An additional 30 districts do not currently have kindergarten, but offer it when parents have students of kindergarten age. These districts are very small.
- 5. Based on first grade enrollment, those 30 districts with no kindergarten programs would enroll approximately 80 students. Of those 30 districts, 7 would not have enrollment, even with kindergarten, that would exceed the base level funding ANB of 9, so no additional foundation program costs are involved for approximately 8 of the 80 students.
- 6. 94 percent of 72 students, counted as 0.50 FTE each, would require approximately \$70,000 in foundation program payments to districts, using an average of current foundation program schedules. This liability currently exists.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

Under current law, the financial obligation exists to provide foundation funding for all kindergarten students. However, passage would increase foundation program expenditures by approximately \$70,000 each fiscal year. Under current law this would increase the general fund appropriation to the foundation program by a like amount.
