- 0 (a) motor vehicle as defined in 61-1-102;
- (b) motorcycle as defined in 61-1-105;
- (c) motor-driven cycle as defined in 61-1-106; and

 - (a) vehicles owned or controlled by the United States

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STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE Form BD-15 In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0213, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

This bill reallocates the vehicle registration noxious weed fee from the state (Department of Agriculture) to county governments where the fee is collected.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Redirection of the \$1,179,483 vehicle weed fee reduces the Noxious Weed Trust Fund Program of the Department of Agriculture to the FY86 level of funding.
- 2. The 0.67 FTE administrative assistant position and support operations would be deleted due to loss of vehicle weed fees
- 3. In FY86 the Department weed coordinator position was funded with general fund. The assumption is that general fund would be reestablished, because of the loss of the vehicle weed funds which have been used to support the weed coordinator position since FY89.
- 4. There will be a reduction of work and a loss of indirect to the Central Management Division of \$27,451 in FY92 and \$27,438 in FY93.
- 5. Research grants on biological agents and nonchemical weed control will decrease by approximately \$270,000 per year. Community noxious weed grants will be eliminated.
