WSE BILL NO. 255 1 S.P.S. to Sugar 2 INTRODUCED BY BY REQUEST OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH, 3 4 WILDLIFE, AND PARKS 5 6 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE ANNUAL 7 RAFFLE OF ONE HUNTING LICENSE EACH FOR MOUNTAIN SHEEP, 8 SHIRAS MOOSE, MOUNTAIN GOAT, AND ELK; AUTHORIZING THE ANNUAL 9 AUCTION OF ONE ELK LICENSE; EXEMPTING AUTHORIZED HUNTING 10 LICENSE RAFFLES FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE PUBLIC GAMBLING 11 LAWS; AMENDING SECTIONS 23-5-405, 87-2-722, AND 87-2-724, 12 MCA; AND PROVIDING EFFECTIVE DATES." 12 13 14 STATEMENT OF INTENT 15 (1) A statement of intent is required for this bill 16 because 87-2-722, 87-2-724, and [sections 3 and 4] grant to 17 the fish and game commission the authority to develop rules 18 regarding the annual raffle of certain hunting licenses and 19 because [section 4] requires that rules be adopted by the 20 commission for the conduct of an annual elk license auction. 21 It is intended that the rules relating to raffles address, 22 at a minimum: 23 (a) the use of licenses issued by raffle; 24 (b) the manner of conduct of hunting license raffles; 25 and



(c) setting of appropriate fees for the raffles. 1 (2) It is intended that rules developed regarding the 2 annual auction of an elk license be similar to the rules 3 regarding the auction of mountain sheep and Shiras moose 4 5 licenses. (3) Because of the unique nature of the hunting license б

authorized by this bill and the statutory raffles 7 requirement for direct oversight of wildlife issues by the A fish and game commission and the department of fish, 9 wildlife, and parks, it is intended that raffles authorized 1.0 under this bill be exempt from the provisions of the 11 gambling laws regarding public raffles.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 14

Section 1. Section 87-2-722, MCA, is amended to read: 15 *87-2-722. Auction and raffle of mountain sheep 16 license. (1) The commission department may issue one male 17 mountain sheep license each year through a competitive 18 auction and one male mountain sheep license each year 19 through a competitive raffle. The commission shall 20 promulgate rules for the use of the license licenses and the 21 conduct of the auction and raffle. A wildlife conservation 22 organization involved in the conservation of mountain sheep 23 may be authorized by the commission to conduct the license 24 auction, in which case the authorized organization may 25

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retain proceeds of the sale, not to exceed 10%, to cover
 reasonable auction expenses. <u>The department shall conduct</u>
 <u>the raffle</u>, which must be for residents only. The commission
 shall set the fee for the raffle.

5 (2) (a) All proceeds remaining from the auction, 6 whether conducted by the commission or as otherwise 7 authorized by the commission, must be used by the department 8 for the substantial benefit of mountain sheep. The proceeds 9 from the auction must be used in addition to any other funds 10 the department uses for the management of mountain sheep. 11 The department shall report to each legislature concerning 12 the use or investment of auction proceeds.

(b) Raffle proceeds must be deposited in the general
license account of the department.
(3) The provisions of Title 23, chapter 5, part 4,
regarding the conduct of public raffles, do not apply to a

Section 2. Section 87-2-724, MCA, is amended to read: 18 "87-2-724. Auction and raffle of Shiras moose license. 19 (1) The commission department may issue one male Shiras 20 21 moose license each year through a competitive auction and 22 one male Shiras moose license each year through a 23 competitive raffle. The commission shall promulgate rules for the use of the license licenses and the conduct of the 24 auction and raffle. A wildlife conservation organization 25

1 involved in the conservation of moose may be authorized by 2 the commission to conduct the license auction, in which case 3 the authorized organization may retain up to 10% of the 4 proceeds of the sale to cover reasonable auction expenses. 5 The department shall conduct the raffle, which must be for б residents only. The commission shall set the fee for the 7 raffle. 8 (2) (a) All proceeds remaining from the auction, 9 whether conducted by the commission or as otherwise 10 authorized by the commission, must be used by the department 11 for the substantial benefit of moose. The proceeds from the 12 auction must be used in addition to any other funds the department uses for the management of moose. The department 13 14 shall report to each legislature concerning the use or 15 investment of auction proceeds. 16 (b) Raffle proceeds must be deposited in the general 17 license account of the department. 18 (3) The provisions of Title 23, chapter 5, part 4, 19 regarding the conduct of public raffles, do not apply to a 20 raffle conducted under this section." NEW SECTION. Section 3. Raffle 21 of mountain goat 22 license. (1) The department may issue one mountain goat 23 license each year through a competitive raffle. The commission shall promulgate rules for the use of the license 24

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the raffle, which must be for residents only. The commission
 shall set the fee for the raffle.

3 (2) Raffle proceeds must be deposited in the general4 license account of the department.

5 (3) The provisions of Title 23, chapter 5, part 4,
6 regarding the conduct of public raffles, do not apply to a
7 raffle conducted under this section.

8 NEW SECTION. Section 4. Auction and raffle of elk 9 license. (1) The department may issue one elk license each year through a competitive auction and one elk license each 10 year through a competitive raffle. The commission shall 11 12 promulgate rules for the use of the licenses and the conduct 13 of the auction and raffle. A wildlife conservation 14 organization involved in the conservation of elk may be 15 authorized by the commission to conduct the license auction, 16 in which case the authorized organization may retain up to 17 10% of the proceeds of the sale to cover reasonable auction 18 expenses. The department shall conduct the raffle, which 19 must be for residents only. The commission shall set the fee 20 for the raffle.

(2) (a) All proceeds remaining from the auction,
whether conducted by the commission or as otherwise
authorized by the commission, must be used by the department
for the substantial benefit of elk. The proceeds from the
auction must be used in addition to any other funds the

department uses for the management of elk. The department shall report to the legislature concerning the use or investment of auction proceeds.

4 (b) Raffle proceeds must be deposited in the general5 license account of the department.

6 (3) The provisions of Title 23, chapter 5, part 4,
7 regarding the conduct of public raffles, do not apply to a
8 raffle conducted under this section.

9 Section 5. Section 23-5-405, MCA, is amended to read:

10 "23-5-405. Authorized live bingo, keno, and raffles.
11 (1) A person may conduct or participate in a live bingo and
12 keno game or raffle only if it is operated pursuant to this
13 part.

14 (2) This part does not apply to a game simulated on a
15 video gambling machine authorized by part 6 of this chapter.
16 (3) This part does not apply to the authorized annual
17 raffle of hunting licenses conducted by the department of
18 fish, wildlife, and parks."

19NEW SECTION.Section 6. Codificationinstruction.20[Sections 3 and 4] are intended to be codified as an21integral part of Title 87, chapter 2, part 7, and the22provisions of Title 87, chapter 2, part 7, apply to23[sections 3 and 4].

24 NEW SECTION. Section 7. Effective dates. (1) Except as
25 provided in subsection (2), [this act] is effective March 2,

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1992.

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>HB0255</u>, <u>as introduced</u>.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

This bill authorizes an annual raffle of one hunting license for mountain sheep, shiras moose, mountain goat, and elk. The bill also authorizes the annual auction of one elk license.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Approximately 28,000 sportsman apply for moose, sheep and goat drawings.
- 2. An estimated 8,000 sportspersons will apply for the raffles 3,500 for sheep and moose and 1,000 for goat.
- 3. The raffles conducted by the state will be on the special drawing applications, one chance per sportsperson.
- 4. The raffle will cost \$5.00 for each chance.
- 5. About 15% of the applicants for special elk permits will apply for elk raffle.

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6. The elk auction will be conducted in FY92 and FY93. The raffles will be conducted in FY93 only. Estimated revenues are as follows:
