12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: NEW SECTION. Section 1. Duties agricultural 13 of experiment station in grasshopper management -- outreach 14 15 programs. (1)The agricultural experiment station established in 20-25-222 shall conduct research oa 16 developing integrated control methods and procedures for 17 management of grasshoppers adversely affecting crop 18 19 production. The research must provide special emphasis on evaluating the use of biological controls developed for 20 rangeland grasshopper control by the USDA/ARS-rangeland 21 insect laboratory and the entomology research laboratory for 22 use on crops. The research must determine how economical and 23 24 effective these biological control agents are for grasshopper management in crops. 25



1 (2) The agricultural experiment station shall also 2 conduct applied research on effective alternative cropland 3 grasshopper management techniques, such as tillage patterns, 4 feeding stimuli, attractants, repellents, and the proper 5 timing of these specific control methods.

6 (3) The agricultural experiment station shall conduct
7 outreach programs in cooperation with the cooperative
8 extension service and others on behalf of agricultural
9 producers and with the public on the use of integrated
10 grasshopper management in cropland.

11 Section 2. Section 80-7-508, MCA, is amended to read: 12 \*80-7-508. Duties of the cooperative extension service. 13 The cooperative extension service within the department of 14 education shall conduct investigations pertaining to insects and other arthropods affecting plants and animals. When an 15 16 injurious infestation of an insect or other arthropod occurs 17 in any part of the state, the authorized employees of the 18 cooperative extension service shall go to the scene of the 19 infestation, shall determine the extent and seriousness of 20 the infestation, and make public the best remedies to be 21 employed. The cooperative extension service shall cooperate with the agricultural experiment station in providing 22 23 outreach programs on the use of integrated grasshopper 24 management in cropland, as set out in [section 1]." 25 NEW SECTION.
