In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0304, as introduced.

### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

This bill allows the Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks to dispose of certain obsolete equipment and department property.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks would only use the provisions of this bill to sell 127 warden handguns.
- 2. The handguns which are to be sold were purchased with general license funds and when the guns are sold the proceeds will be deposited into the general license account.
- 3. A professional appraiser estimated the value of the handguns at \$280 per gun for a total value of 127 guns at \$35,575.
- 4. An auctioneer would be paid 6% of gross sales to perform the public auction.
