a bill for an act entitled: "an act to change the method of calculating the average number belonging of a school DISTRICT FOR SCHOOL FUNDING PURPOSES BY TAKING A PUPIL enrollment count on october 1 and on march 1 of the school FISCAL YEAR; AMENDING SECTIONS 20-4-301, 20-9-311, AND 20-9-313, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."
be it enacted by the legislature of the state of montana:
Section 1. Section 20-4-301, MCA, is amended to read:
"20-4-301. Duties of teacher -- nonpayment for failure to comply. (1) Any teacher under contract with a district shall:
(a) conform to and enforce the laws, board of public education policies, and the policies of the trustees of the district;
(b) utilize the course of instruction prescribed by the trustees;
(c) keep, in a neat and businesslike manner, a teacher's register in the form and on the blanks prescribed by the superintendent of public instruction;
(d) within 10 days after the-eonetusion-of each sehoot semester date provided in 20-9-311 for enrollment counts,
prepare a report in the manner and on the forms prescribed by the superintendent of public instructionf--whieh--mast inetude--the--pupit--attendance--and--absence--data-from-his teacher's-register-that-is-necessary-to-cateutate-ANB. The report must be submitted to:
(i) the district superintendent, if there is one;
(ii) the principal of the school, if there is one and there is no district superintendent; or
(iii) the county superintendent or all county superintendents when the teacher is reporting for a joint district, if there is no district superintendent or principal:.
(e) exercise due diligence in the care of school grounds and buildings, furniture, equipment, books, and supplies; and
(f) provide moral and civic instruction by:
(i) endeavoring to impress the pupils with the principles of morality, truth, justice, and patriotism;
(ii) teaching the pupils to avoid idleness, profanity, and falsehood;
(iii) instructing the pupils in the principles of free government and training them to comprehend the rights, responsibilities, and dignity of American citizenship.
(2) The trustees are authorized to withhold the salary warrant of any teacher who does not comply with the
provisions of subsection（1）（a）or（1）（b）until the teacher does comply with the provisions．
（3）The trustees may not pay any teacher his last month＇s salary until he has provided a complete and accurate semester report to the required person，as determined by the person and as required in subsection（l）（d）of this section．＂

Section 2．Section 20－9－311，MCA，is amended to read：

 days approved for the school fiscal year; and(d) dividing the amount determined in subsection (1)(c) by 180 .
(2) If a student spends less than half his time in the regular program and the balance of his time in school in the special education program, he is considered a full-time special pupil but is not considered regularly enrolled for ANB purposes. If a student spends half or more of his time in school in the regular program and the balance of his time in the special education program, he is considered regularly enrolled for ANB purposes.
(3) The average number belonging of the regularly enrolled, full-time pupils for the public schools of a district must be based on the aggregate of all the regularly enrolled, full-time pupils attending the schools of the district, except that when:
(a) a school of the district is located more than 3 miles beyond the incorporated limits of a city or town or from another school of the district, all of the regularly enrolled, full-time pupils of the school must be calculated individually for and purposes;
(b) a junior high school has been approved and accredited as a junior high school, all of the regularly enrolled, full-time pupils of the junior high school must be
considered as high school district pupils for ANB purposes;
(c) a middle school has been approved and accredited, all pupils below the 7 th grade must be considered elementary school pupils for ANB purposes and the 7 th and 8th grade pupils must be considered high school pupils for anB purposes; or
(d) a school has not been accredited by the board of public education, the regularly enrolled, full-time pupils attending the nonaccredited school are not eligible for average number belonging calculation purposes, nor will an average number belonging for the nonaccredited school be used in determining the foundation program for the district.

 The method for calculating an equivalent ANB must be determined in a manner prescribed by the superintendent of public instruction when a district has:
(a) lith or 12 th grade students regularly enrolled on a part-time basis;
(b) pupils enrolled in a kindergarten program established under the provisions of 20-7-117; or
(c) other part-time programs approved by the board of public education."

Section 3. Section 20-9-313, $M C A$, is amended to read:
"20-9-313. Circumstances under which the regular average number belonging may be increased. The average number belonging of a school, calculated in accordance with the ANB formula prescribed in 20-9-311, may be increased when:
(1) the opening of a new elementary school or the reopening of an elementary school has been approved in accordance with 20-6-502. The average number belonging for the school must be established by the county superintendent and approved, disapproved, or adjusted by the superintendent of public instruction.
(2) the opening or reopening of a high school or a branch of the county high school has been approved in accordance with 20-6-503, 20-6-504, or 20-6-505. The average number belonging for the high school must be established by the county superintendent's estimate, after an investigation of the probable number of pupils that will attend the high school.
(3) a district anticipates an increase in the average number belonging due to the closing of any private or public school in the district or a neighboring district. The estimated increase in average number belonging must be established by the trustees and the county superintendent and approved, disapproved, or adjusted by the superintendent of public instruction no later than the fourth Monday in

## June.

(4) a district anticipates an unusual enrolment increase in the ensuing school fiscal year. The increase in average number belonging must be based on estimates of increased enrollment approved by the superintendent of public instruction and must be computed in the manner prescribed by 20-9-314.
(5) for the initial year of operation of a program established under 20-7-117(1), the ANB to be used for budget purposes is the same as one-half the number of 5 -year-old children residing in the district as of September 10 of the preceding school year, either as shown on the official school census or as determined by some other procedure approved by the superintendent of public instruction;
(6) a full-time special pupil, as defined in 20-9-311, in a given school fiscal year may no longer be considered a full-time special pupil in the ensuing school fiscal year (the superintendent of public instruction may grant one ANB for the pupil for the ensuing school fiscal year) ; or
(7) a high school district provides early graduation for any student who completes graduation requirements in less than eight semesters or--the--equivazent--amount--of secondary--sehooz--enrołzment-or-when-a-high-schoot-distriet provides-earły-graduation-for-a-ełass-of-students--who--have completed---the---mequifements----for--graduation--after--i75
pupit-instfuetion-days-in-the-zzth-grade. The increase must be established by the trustees as though the student had attended to the end of the school fiscal year and must be approved, disapproved, or adjusted by the superintendent of public instruction."

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0322, as introduced.
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## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to change the method of calculating the average number belonging of a school district for school funding purposes by taking a pupil enrollment count on October 1 and March 1 of the school fiscal year.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. That enrollment less prekindergarten, ungraded, and half time kindergarten would approximate the enrollment data for the bill's ANB calculations.
2. The foundation schedules remain at the fiscal 1991 level.
3. Second semester enrollment would be approximately 2 percent lower than first semester.
4. The proposed change would increase ANB by 682 in fiscal 1992 and 143 in fiscal 1993.

## Expenditures:

The cost of state equalization aid would increase $\$ 1,742,000$ in fiscal 1992 and $\$ 364,000$ in fiscal 1993.
