 4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE
 5 GOVERNOR'S SALARY AS A PERCENTAGE OF THE SALARY PAID TO U.S.
 6 REPRESENTATIVES; ESTABLISHING THE SALARY OF EACH PRINCIPAL
 7 DEPARTMENT'S DIRECTOR OR COMMISSIONER, EXCEPT THE ADJUTANT
 8 GENERAL, AS A PERCENTAGE OF THE GOVERNOR'S SALARY; AMENDING
 9 SECTION 2-16-405, MCA; AND PROVIDING A DELAYED EFFECTIVE
 10 DATE AND AN APPLICABILITY DATE."

 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

13 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Salaries of governor and
 14 directors of principal departments. (1) The governor's
 15 salary must be equivalent to 80% of the salary paid to U.S.
 16 representatives in the year previous to the year the
 17 governor takes office.

18 (2) The salary of each director or commissioner of a
 19 principal department listed in 2-15-104, except the adjutant
 20 general, must be equivalent to 80% of the governor's salary
 21 as determined under subsection (1).

22 **Section 2.** Section 2-16-405, MCA, is amended to read:

23 "2-16-405. Salaries of certain elected state officials.
 24 The salaries paid to certain elected officials of the state
 25 of Montana for fiscal year 1990 and following years are:

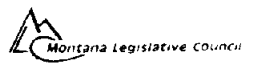
16 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Codification instruction.

STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0330, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act establishing the Governor's salary as a percentage of the salary paid to U. S. Representatives; establishing the salary of each principal department director or commissioner, except the adjutant general, as a percentage of the governor's salary and providing a delayed effective date and an applicability date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. A U. S. Representative's salary is \$125,100.
2. The next governor will be elected in November, 1992. The applicability date of this act applies to governor's elected after January 1, 1993 which would apply to the governor elected November, 1996.

FISCAL IMPACT:


There is no fiscal impact in either FY92 or FY93 due to the applicability date.

LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

There would be a fiscal impact of approximately \$244,000 in the last six months of FY97 and of approximately \$488,000 in each fiscal year after that. The general fund would be impacted by approximately 90% of the total with state special and federal funds absorbing the remaining 10%.

TECHNICAL NOTES:

There will be additional impacts from this act. 23-5-1011, MCA, sets the annual salary of the director of the Montana Lottery at 90% of the annual salary of the director of the department of commerce. Also, 23-5-1013, MCA, sets the annual salary of the assistant director of security of the Montana Lottery at 90% of the salary of the director of the Montana Lottery.
