HersE BILL NO. 358 Jom Helden 1 efit 2nd Del INTRODUCED BY 2 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO SUBMIT TO THE 4 5 QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF MONTANA AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLE V, SECTIONS 3 AND 9, OF THE MONTANA CONSTITUTION TO LENGTHEN 6 7 THE TERM OF OFFICE OF LEGISLATORS: TO PROVIDE THAT AS NEAR 8 AS POSSIBLE TO ONE-THIRD OF THE SENATORS MUST BE ELECTED 9 EVERY 2 YEARS; TO LIMIT THE NUMBER OF TERMS THAT A 10 LEGISLATOR MAY SERVE; TO REQUIRE THE REAPPORTIONMENT 11 COMMISSION TO IMPLEMENT THE AMENDMENT REQUIRING AS NEAR AS 12 POSSIBLE TO ONE-THIRD OF THE SENATORS TO BE ELECTED EVERY 2 13 YEARS; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE AND AN 14 APPLICABILITY PROVISION,"

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

17 Section 1. Article V, section 3, of The Constitution of the State of Montana is amended to read: 18

"Section 3. Election and terms. A member of the house 19 20 of representatives shall be elected for a term of two four 21 years and a member of the senate for a term of four six 22 years each to begin on a date provided by law. One-half As 23 near as possible to one-third of the senators shall be 24 elected every two years."

25 Section 2. Article V, section 9, of The Constitution of

the State of Montana is amended to read: 1

"Section 9. Disqualification. (1) No member of the 2 legislature shall, during the term for which he shall have 3 been elected, be appointed to any civil office under the 4 state; and no member of congress, or other person holding an 5 6 office (except notary public, or the militia) under the United States or this state, shall be a member of the 7 legislature during his continuance in office. 8

9 (2) A legislator may not serve more than two consecutive terms in either the senate or the house of 10 11 representatives. A person may not serve another term in a house in which he has served two consecutive terms." 12

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Transition. The commission 13 provided for in Article V, section 14, of the Montana 14 15 constitution shall, using criteria developed by the 16 commission, include in the plan it submits to the 1993 regular session of the legislature provisions with respect 17 18 to the new senate districts that will take effect for all purposes in January 1995 that: 19

20 (1) divide the districts into three groups with as near as possible to one-third of the districts in each group; 21

(2) state which group of new districts must have 22 23 senators with a first term of office that expires in January 1997, which group must have senators with a first term of 24 office that explices in January 1999, and which group must 25
