\*75-10-233. Dumping penalty -- enforcement. Any A person found guilty of a violation of 75-10-212(2) shall for a first offense be fined in-the-sum-not-exceeding-\$100-or imprisoned-in-the-county-jail-for-a-period-not-exceeding--30 days--or--be-punished-by-both-such-fine-and-imprisonmenty-in the-discretion-of-the-court less than \$250 and for a second or subsequent offense be fined not less than \$250 or more than \$500. In addition, each offender shall be ordered to spend up to 240 hours removing litter, under the supervision of a county government agency that the court finds appropriate, in the county in which the offense occurred. The provisions of 75-10-212(2) shall be enforced by all highway patrol officers, sheriffs, policemen, and all other enforcement agencies and officers of the state of Montana. In addition, game wardens shall have the right to enforce the provisions of 75-10-212(2) on public recreational
