STATEMENT OF INTENT

12
 13 A statement of intent is required for this bill because
 14 [section 3] requires the department of fish, wildlife, and
 15 parks to develop rules to implement a program for management
 16 of wild buffalo or bison that have not been reduced to
 17 captivity and that threaten property or persons in this
 18 state. It is intended that the rules be consistent, as far
 19 as practicable, with the general nongame wildlife management
 20 policy set out in 87-5-103, except that the department may
 21 provide for means of controlling or eliminating wild buffalo
 22 or bison that pose a potential threat to property or persons
 23 in Montana and may adopt other rules specific to wild
 24 buffalo or bison as may be necessary for the proper and safe
 25 management of the species. It is intended that the authority

1 of the department be exercised in coordination with and
 2 complementary to the authority of the department of
 3 livestock to regulate, control, and eliminate wild buffalo
 4 or bison that pose a threat of the transmission of
 5 contagious disease to Montana livestock.

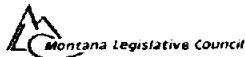
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 87-2-701, MCA, is amended to read:

9 "87-2-701. (Temporary) Special licenses. (1) Any
 10 applicant who will be 12 years of age or older prior to
 11 September 15 of the season for which the license is issued
 12 and is the holder of a resident wildlife conservation
 13 license or a nonresident wildlife conservation license may

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0390, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:


This bill eliminates the sale of special wild buffalo licenses; removes the wild buffalo from designation as a game animal; establishes the wild buffalo or bison as a nongame species in need of management; and establishes Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks management duties.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. In the past few years, bison control was primarily accomplished by using sportsmen to harvest the animals. The control actions cost more to administer than revenues generated from sale of the licenses (costs of \$272,000 with revenue of \$161,000 over the last 3.5 years).
2. If sportsmen do not harvest bison, the costs for the Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks to harvest the animals will not exceed what currently is being spend.
3. A long-range management plan for bison is currently being developed by the state and the National Park Service. There will be some development costs to the Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks, but neither the required details of the plan, nor the involvement of the department is known at this time.
