In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0432, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A bill to provide a retirement allowance at age 50 for members of the sheriffs' retirement system who are involuntarily discontinued from service after five years of service.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. This bill will provide a monthly retirement allowance to a member of the sheriffs' retirement system who is involuntarily discontinued from service after completing at least five years of service, beginning on his/her 50th birthday and actuarially reduced from either 60 years of age or 24 years of service, whichever provides the higher retirement allowance.
- 2. Since current law provides such an allowance to a member only after completion of ten years of service, and the allowance now may not begin until the member's 55th birthday, additional members will be eligible for the allowance for a longer period of time.
- 3. An actuarial valuation of the sheriffs' retirement system has determined that the cost to fund this benefit enhancement will be an additional .09% of each active member's compensation. This amount would be sufficient to fund the benefits as they are earned in the future and to fund the additional past service liability created by this bill over a period of 40 years.
- 4. The present funding structure for this retirement system (14.67% of salaries) is sufficient to provide this increase without a statutory increase in either employer or employee contribution rates.
- 5. It is not possible to accurately project the impact on actual benefit payments during the coming biennium due to a lack of information about whether members terminating in the past with between five and ten years of service would be eligible under the involuntary retirement provisions of this bill.
- 6. The Public Employees Retirement Division can absorb any administrative costs of this legislation in the recommended executive budget for the 1993 biennium.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Minimal impact on sheriffs' retirement system.

LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

This benefit enhancement will cause an unfunded liability to accrue to the sheriffs retirement system which currently has no unfunded liability. The current statutory funding rate in this system is sufficient to amortize this new unfunded liability over a period of 40 years.
