A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT INCREASING THE NUMBER OF REPORTING TIMES FOR STATEWIDE BALLOT ISSUE COMMITTEES TO FILE REPORTS; REVISING CAMPAIGN REPORTING REQUIREMENTS CONCERNING IDENTIFICATION OF PERSONS MAKING CERTAIN CONTRIBUTIONS; REVISING CERTAIN LIMITS ON CONTRIBUTIONS SUBJECT TO REPORTING; REQUIRING THAT EMPLOYERS OF CONTRIBUTORS BE IDENTIFIED; AND AMENDING SECTIONS 13-37-226, 13-37-228, AND 13-37-229, MCA."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 13-37-226, MCA, is amended to read:

"13-37-226. Time for filing reports. (1) Candidates for a state office filled by a statewide vote of all the electors of Montana and political committees which that are specifically organized to support or oppose a particular statewide candidate or-issue shall file reports:

(a) quarterly, due on the fifth day following a calendar quarter, beginning with the calendar quarter in which funds are received or expended during the year or years prior to the election year that:

4 this section during the reporting period;

5 (10) the total sum of all receipts received by or for 6 the committee or candidate during the reporting period; and

7 (11) other information that may be required by the 8 commissioner to fully disclose the sources of funds used to 9 support or oppose candidates or issues."
