8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 1. State parks improvement fee ---10 disposition. (1) A special state parks improvement fee of 50 11 cents is assessed on the annual registration of each motor 12 vehicle subject to registration. The fee must be collected 13 by the county treasurer.

14 (2) As used in this section, "motor vehicle" has the
15 same meaning as in 61-3-510, and the exemptions allowed in
16 61-3-510 apply to the provisions of this section.

17 (3) The county treasurer shall deposit 3% of the money 18 collected under this section in the county general fund for 19 costs of collection, and the remainder must be deposited in 20 the state special revenue fund to the credit of the 21 department of fish, wildlife, and parks.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction.
(Section 1) is intended to be codified as an integral part
of Title 61, chapter 3, part 5, and the provisions of Title
61, chapter 3, part 5, apply to [section 1].

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act imposing a special parks improvement fee on registration of motor vehicles.

### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. There are 1,098,000 motor vehicles registered in Montana.
- 2. A \$0.50 fee on all motor vehicle registrations would generate \$549,000.
- 3. A 3% collection fee (\$16,470) will be retained by the county treasurer. The agency will receive \$532,530 each year.
