In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0556, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

This bill revises the law regarding game farms and game farm animals, including the identification, transportation, taxation, and inspection of game farm animals and reports required of game farm licensees, and provides that importation permits and health certificates are required of game farm animals.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The Department of Livestock currently monitors the importation of game farm animals.
- 2. Individual identification of game animals will be conducted at the owners expense.
- 3. Violations of the law and enforcement could increase department expenditures, but this will be absorbed in the current budget for the 1993 biennium.

FISCAL IMPACT: No significant fiscal impact.

LONG-RANGE EFFECTS:

The Department of Livestock will monitor expenses resulting from this proposed legislation and report to the next session of the Legislature. It may become necessary to include game farm animals under the per capita tax collected for operation of the department.

TECHNICAL OR MECHANICAL DEFECTS:

Section 3(2) providing 30 days may be too long a time period for effective enforcement. Ten days is recommended by the department.
