 4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROVIDING HAZARDOUS  
 5 DUTY PAY TO EMPLOYEES AT THE MONTANA STATE PRISON AND THE  
 6 WOMEN'S CORRECTION CENTER BY RAISING THEIR POSITIONS A PAY  
 7 GRADE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND AN APPLICABILITY  
 8 DATE."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11 NEW SECTION. **Section 1.** Hazardous duty pay --  
 12 correction institutions. To compensate employees working in  
 13 a dangerous environment, the pay grade of each employee's  
 14 position at the Montana state prison at Deer Lodge and the  
 15 women's correction center at Warm Springs must be raised one  
 16 grade above the position's classified grade as determined  
 17 through the state's classification plan under part 2 of this  
 18 chapter.

19 NEW SECTION. **Section 2.** Codification instruction.  
 20 [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an integral part  
 21 of Title 2, chapter 18, part 3, and the provisions of Title  
 22 2, chapter 18, part 3, apply to [section 1].

23 NEW SECTION. **Section 3.** Effective date. [This act] is  
 24 effective July 1, 1991.

25 NEW SECTION. **Section 4.** Applicability. [Section 1]

1 applies to all employees employed at the Montana state  
 2 prison and the women's correction center on or after [the  
 3 effective date of this act].

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A bill for an act entitled: "An act providing hazardous duty pay to employees at the Montana State Prison and the women's Correction Center by raising their positions a pay grade; and providing an effective date and an applicability date."
