- 3. Increased hunter pressure will increase the need to monitor elk, deer and bird. In some cases, special seasons may have to be implemented. Increased coordination will be required for block management with landowners. This will require an additional .25 FTE in the Field Services Division.
- 4. It costs \$2.50 to process each application (one third for personal services and two thirds for operations).
- 5. The department will receive 3,000 additional applications.
- 6. The increase in the Wildlife Habitat Trust account will provide an additional \$6,500 per year in interest income which will be used to operate and maintain wildlife habitats.
