 5 HUNTING LICENSE QUOTAS AND LICENSE FEES; INCREASING CLASS  
 6 AAA, CLASS B-10, AND CLASS B-11 LICENSE FEES; ESTABLISHING A  
 7 CLASS B-11-W LICENSE AND DEFINING ITS TERMS AND FEE; AND  
 8 AMENDING SECTIONS 87-2-504, 87-2-505, 87-2-510, 87-2-511,  
 9 AND 87-2-711, MCA."

 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

12 **Section 1.** Section 87-2-505, MCA, is amended to read:

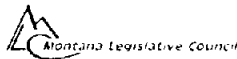
13 "87-2-505. (Temporary) Class B-10--nonresident big game  
 14 combination license. Except as otherwise provided in this  
 15 chapter, a person not a resident, as defined in 87-2-102,  
 16 but who will be 12 years of age or older prior to September  
 17 15 of the season for which the license is issued may, upon  
 18 payment of the fee of ~~\$450~~ \$475 and subject to the  
 19 limitations prescribed by law and department regulation,  
 20 apply to the fish and game office, Helena, Montana, to  
 21 purchase a B-10 nonresident big game combination license  
 22 which shall entitle the holder to all the privileges of  
 23 Class B, Class B-1, Class B-7, and black bear licenses, and  
 24 an elk tag. This license includes the nonresident  
 25 conservation license as prescribed in 87-2-202. Not more

4 **87-2-505.** (Effective March 1, 1994) Class

 6 otherwise provided in this chapter, a person not a resident,  
 7 as defined in 87-2-102, but who will be 12 years of age or  
 8 older prior to September 15 of the season for which the  
 9 license is issued may, upon payment of the fee of ~~\$375~~ \$398  
 10 and subject to the limitations prescribed by law and  
 11 department regulation, apply to the fish and game office,  
 12 Helena, Montana, to purchase a B-10 nonresident big game  
 13 combination license which shall entitle the holder to all  
 14 the privileges of Class B, Class B-1, Class B-7, and black  
 15 bear licenses, and an elk tag. This license includes the  
 16 nonresident conservation license as prescribed in 87-2-202.

 21 licenses. This license includes the nonresident wildlife  
 22 conservation license as prescribed in 87-2-202.

23 (2) Six thousand Class B-11 licenses are authorized for  
 24 sale each license year."

25 **Section 3.** Section 87-2-511, MCA, is amended to read:

1 "87-2-511. Sale of Class B-10 and, Class B-11, and  
 2 Class B-11-W licenses. (1) The department shall offer the  
 3 Class B-10 and, Class B-11, and Class B-11-W licenses for  
 4 sale on March 15, with 5,760 6,167 of the authorized Class  
 5 B-10 licenses and, 2,000 Class B-11 licenses, and 1,000  
 6 Class B-11-W licenses reserved for applicants indicating  
 7 their intent to use the services of a licensed outfitter,  
 8 and 2,000 of the authorized Class B-11 licenses and 1,000 of  
 9 the authorized Class B-11-W licenses reserved for applicants  
 10 indicating their intent to hunt with a resident sponsor on  
 11 land owned by that sponsor, as provided in subsections (2)  
 12 and (3).

13 (2) Each application for a reserved license under  
 14 subsection (1) must contain a written affirmation that the  
 15 applicant intends to hunt with a licensed outfitter or a  
 16 resident sponsor and must indicate the name of the licensed  
 17 outfitter or resident sponsor with whom the applicant  
 18 intends to hunt. In addition, the application must be  
 19 accompanied by a certificate that is signed by a licensed  
 20 outfitter or resident sponsor and which affirms that the  
 21 outfitter or resident will:

22 (a) direct the applicant's hunting and advise the  
 23 applicant of game and trespass laws of the state;

24 (b) submit to the department, in a manner prescribed by  
 25 the department, complete records of who hunted with him,

1 where they hunted, and what game was taken; and

2 (c) accept no monetary consideration for enabling the  
3 nonresident applicant to obtain a license or for providing  
4 any services or assistance to the nonresident applicant,  
5 except as provided in this title.

6 (3) The certificate signed by the resident sponsor  
7 pursuant to subsection (2) must also affirm that the sponsor  
8 is a landowner and that the applicant under the certificate  
9 will hunt only on land owned by the sponsor.

10 (4) The department shall make the reserved Class B-10  
11 and, Class B-11, and Class B-11-W licenses that remain  
12 unsold on April 15 available to nonresident applicants  
13 without restriction as to hunting with a licensed outfitter  
14 or resident sponsor.

15 (5) All Class B-10 and, Class B-11, and Class B-11-W  
16 licenses not reserved under subsection (1) and all unsold  
17 reserved licenses available under subsection (4) must be  
18 issued by a drawing among all applicants for the respective  
19 unreserved licenses."

20 **Section 4.** Section 87-2-711, MCA, is amended to read:

21 "87-2-711. (Temporary) Class AAA--sportsman's license.  
22 Any resident, as defined by 87-2-102, who will be 12 years  
23 of age or older prior to September 15 of the season for  
24 which the license is issued, upon payment of the sum of  
25 \$45-50 \$60, shall be entitled to a sportsman's license which

1 shall permit the holder to exercise all rights granted to  
2 holders of Class A, A-1, A-3, A-5, A-6, and resident  
3 conservation licenses as prescribed in 87-2-202. The  
4 department shall furnish each holder of a sportsman's  
5 license an appropriate decal. (Terminates March 1,  
6 1994--sec. 12, Ch. 598, L. 1987.)

7 **87-2-711. (Effective March 1, 1994) Class**  
8 **AAA--sportsman's license.** Any resident, as defined by  
9 87-2-102, who will be 12 years of age or older prior to  
10 September 15 of the season for which the license is issued,  
11 upon payment of the sum of ~~\$30-50~~ \$53, shall be entitled to  
12 a sportsman's license which shall permit the holder to  
13 exercise all rights granted to holders of Class A, A-1, A-3,  
14 A-5, A-6, and resident conservation licenses as prescribed  
15 in 87-2-202. The department shall furnish each holder of a  
16 sportsman's license an appropriate decal."

17 **NEW SECTION. Section 5. Class B-11-W--nonresident**  
18 **whitetail deer combination license.** (1) Except as otherwise  
19 provided in this chapter, a person not a resident, as  
20 defined in 87-2-102, but who will be 12 years of age or  
21 older prior to September 15 of the season for which the  
22 license is issued may, upon payment of a fee of \$250 and  
23 subject to the limitations prescribed by law and department  
24 regulation, apply to the fish and game office, Helena,  
25 Montana, to purchase a Class B-11-W nonresident whitetail

1 deer combination license that entitles the holder to all the  
2 privileges of the Class B, Class B-1, and Class B-7  
3 licenses. This license includes the nonresident wildlife  
4 conservation license as prescribed in 87-2-202.

5 (2) Three thousand Class B-11-W licenses are authorized  
6 for sale each license year.

7 **Section 6.** Section 87-2-504, MCA, is amended to read:

8 "87-2-504. (Temporary) Class B-7 and B-8--nonresident  
9 deer licenses. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter,  
10 a person not a resident, as defined in 87-2-102, but who  
11 will be 12 years of age or older prior to September 15 of  
12 the season for which the license is issued and is a holder  
13 of a nonresident conservation license may, upon payment of  
14 the proper fee or fees and subject to the limitations  
15 prescribed by law and department regulation, be entitled to  
16 apply to the fish and game office, Helena, Montana, to  
17 purchase one each of the following licenses: Class B-7, deer  
18 A tag, \$150; Class B-8, deer B tag, \$50; and will entitle  
19 the holder to pursue, hunt, shoot, and kill the game animal  
20 or animals authorized by the license held and to possess the  
21 carcasses of those animals as authorized by department  
22 rules. Unless purchased as part of a B-10 or, B-11, or  
23 B-11-W license, a Class B-7 license must be assigned for use  
24 in a specific administrative region or portion thereof. If  
25 purchased as part of a Class B-11 or B-11-W license, the

1 Class B-7 license is valid throughout the state. If  
2 purchased as part of a Class B-11-W license, the Class B-7  
3 license is limited to whitetail deer only. Not more than  
4 5,000 Class B-7 licenses may be sold in any license year.  
5 Money received from the sale of Class B-7 licenses in excess  
6 of 1,700 must be used as provided in 87-1-242(1).  
7 (Terminates March 1, 1994--sec. 12, Ch. 598, L. 1987.)

8 87-2-504. (Effective March 1, 1994) Class B-7 and  
9 B-8--nonresident deer licenses. Except as otherwise provided  
10 in this chapter, a person not a resident, as defined in  
11 87-2-102, but who will be 12 years of age or older prior to  
12 September 15 of the season for which the license is issued  
13 and is a holder of a nonresident conservation license may,  
14 upon payment of the proper fee or fees and subject to the  
15 limitations prescribed by law and department regulation, be  
16 entitled to apply to the fish and game office, Helena,  
17 Montana, to purchase one each of the following licenses:  
18 Class B-7, deer A tag, \$100; Class B-8, deer B tag, \$50; and  
19 will entitle the holder to pursue, hunt, shoot, and kill the  
20 game animal or animals authorized by the license held and to  
21 possess the carcasses of those animals as authorized by  
22 department rules. Unless purchased as part of a B-10 or,  
23 B-11, or B-11-W license, a Class B-7 license must be  
24 assigned for use in a specific administrative region or  
25 portion thereof. If purchased as part of a Class B-11 or

1 B-11-W license, the Class B-7 license is valid throughout  
2 the state. If purchased as part of a Class B-11-W license,  
3 the Class B-7 license is limited to whitetail deer only."

4 NEW SECTION. Section 7. Codification instruction.  
5 [Section 5] is intended to be codified as an integral part  
6 of Title 87, chapter 2, part 5, and the provisions of Title  
7 87, chapter 2, part 5, apply to [section 5].

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act increasing fees and quotas for certain license and establishing a class B-11-W license. Specifically the proposed bill: 1)Increases the number of nonresident big game combination licenses from 17,000 to 18,500; 2)Increases the nonresident big game license fee from \$450 to \$475; 3)Increases the number of nonresident big game combination licenses reserved for applicants indicating their intent to use the services of a licensed outfitter from 5,600 to 6,167; 4)Increases the nonresident deer license from \$200 to \$250; 5)Creates a nonresident whitetail deer licenses and authorizes that 3,000 can be sold at \$250 each; 6)Allocates 1,000 of the nonresident whitetail deer licenses for applicants indicating their intent to use the services of a licensed outfitter and 1,000 of the licenses for applicants indicating their intent to hunt with a resident sponsor on land owned by that sponsor; and; 7)Increases the cost of a resident sportsman license from \$45.50 to \$60.


ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks will continue to sell all nonresident combination licenses.
2. Five percent of resident sportman license buyers will not purchase the license due to the increase in price from \$45.50 to \$60.
3. Increased hunter pressure will increase the need to monitor elk, deer and bird. In some cases, special seasons may have to be implemented. Increased coordination will be required for block management with landowners. This will require an additional .25 FTE in the Field Services Division.
4. It costs \$2.50 to process each application (one third for personal services and two thirds for operations).
5. The department will receive 3,000 additional applications.
6. The increase in the Wildlife Habitat Trust account will provide an additional \$6,500 per year in interest income which will be used to operate and maintain wildlife habitats.

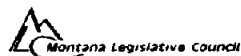

**Section 1.** Section 87-2-511, MCA, is amended to read:

"87-2-511. Sale of Class B-10 and, Class B-11, and Class B-11-W licenses. (1) The department shall offer the Class B-10 and, Class B-11, and Class B-11-W licenses for sale on March 15, with 5,600 ~~6,167~~ 5,600 of the authorized Class B-10 licenses and, 2,000 Class B-11 licenses, and 1,000 Class B-11-W licenses reserved for applicants indicating their intent to use the services of a licensed outfitter, and 2,000 of the authorized Class B-11 licenses and 1,000 of the authorized Class B-11-W licenses reserved for applicants indicating their intent to hunt with a resident sponsor on land owned by that sponsor, as provided in subsections (2) and (3).

(2) Each application for a reserved license under subsection (1) must contain a written affirmation that the applicant intends to hunt with a licensed outfitter or a resident sponsor and must indicate the name of the licensed outfitter or resident sponsor with whom the applicant intends to hunt. In addition, the application must be accompanied by a certificate that is signed by a licensed outfitter or resident sponsor and which affirms that the outfitter or resident will:

(a) direct the applicant's hunting and advise the applicant of game and trespass laws of the state;

1 (b) submit to the department, in a manner prescribed by  
2 the department, complete records of who hunted with him,  
3 where they hunted, and what game was taken; and

4 (c) accept no monetary consideration for enabling the  
5 nonresident applicant to obtain a license or for providing
