13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 1. Short title. [This act] may be 15 cited as the "Youth Voting Act".

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 2. Purpose and intent. The intent 17 of the legislature is to establish a nonpartisan youth 18 voting program that will:

19 (1) provide the youth of Montana with practical20 experience in the democratic process;

(2) increase the likelihood that Montana's youth will
participate in the process as adult voters and encourage the
participation of more parents in elections;

24 (3) not benefit any elected official, candidate for25 elective office, political party, campaign for or against



any ballot issue, or any measure attempting to qualify for placement on a ballot; and

(4) be entirely funded through private donations.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 3. Youth voting program
established -- program coordination -- school participation.
(1) There is a youth voting program for minors to provide
young Montanans direct experience in the voting process.

8 (2) The secretary of state, in consultation with the 9 superintendent of public instruction, shall solicit schools 10 throughout the state to participate in the youth voting 11 program. The secretary of state and the superintendent of 12 public instruction shall confer with the chief election 13 officers and county superintendents of schools and, from 14 among interested schools, shall designate which schools may participate in the program. A designated school may, at any 15 16 time, decline to participate by notifying the secretary of 17 state in writing.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 4. Curriculum development. (1)
19 The secretary of state and the superintendent of public
20 instruction shall compile a curriculum and establish a
21 process whereby:

(a) students are instructed on the electoral process,
the importance of voting, and how to mark and cast a ballot;
(b) students are educated about current issues in a
manner appropriate for each grade level involved;

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1 (c) students cast facsimile or mock ballots while 2 accompanying their parents to polling places during regular 3 elections; and

4 (d) ballots cast by students at elections are counted 5 and the results are made available to all participating 6 schools.

7 (2) The curriculum must be presented to participating8 schools in a nonpartisan, nonbiased, and informative manner.

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 5. Responsibilities of 10 participating schools. Participating schools shall, in a 11 timely manner, provide to students and their parents or 12 guardians instruction and guidance on how to participate in 13 the program, youth voter registration procedures and 14 deadlines, a list of candidates and issues, and polling and 15 balloting procedures.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 6. Polling place procedures. (1)
17 The secretary of state and the superintendent of public
18 instruction shall work with county election officials to
19 provide that:

(a) facsimile or mock ballots are distributed to
polling places in counties with participating schools;

(b) participating students accompanied by a parent or
eligible voter are allowed to cast ballots in the youth
election; and

25 (c) student ballots are counted and the results are

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1 announced to the participating schools.

2 (2) The provisions of this section must be carried out
3 in a manner that will not interfere with the normal voting
4 process or established polling place procedures.

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 7. Funding. (1) Public money may 6 not be used to support or fund the youth voting program 7 established in [sections 1 through 8].

8 (2) A nonprofit corporation may be formed subject to 9 the provisions of Title 35, chapter 2, to solicit donations 10 from private sources. Money solicited under this subsection 11 must be used only for the youth voting program.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 8. Reports. (1) Each biennium,
the secretary of state shall provide, upon request, a report
to the legislature outlining the program's effectiveness in
achieving its objectives.

16 (2) Participating schools and agencies shall provide to
17 the secretary of state information regarding the youth
18 voting program for the secretary of state's report to the
19 legislature.

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB606, as introduced.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act establishing a youth voting program to educate Montana's youth in the democratic process; providing that the Secretary of State and the Superintendent of Public Instruction develop and coordinate the program; and allowing students from participating schools to cast mock ballots at designated polling places during elections if the students are accompanied by a parent or eligible voter.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Program will be operated and supported by a non-profit corporation supported by private donations.
- 2. Current staff levels are sufficient for program implementation.
- 3. This bill requires private funding.
- 4. No state dollars will be used.
- 5. Private donations and vendors of election equipment will fund the costs of this program, creating no additional cost to local governments.

## FISCAL IMPACT:

None, private funds will be used.

## EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUES OR EXPENDITURES:

None is anticipated in that private funds will be used.

### LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

It is hoped that increased voter participation and registration will occur as a result of this program and Montana's Secretary of State will win his Maine lobster dinner.

## TECHNICAL NOTES:

This bill appears to allow for disqualification of interested schools. That would appear to be in conflict with the establishment and purpose of this act.

13 (2) A nonprofit corporation may be formed subject to
14 the provisions of Title 35, chapter 2, to solicit donations
15 from private sources. Money solicited under this subsection
16 must be used only for the youth voting program.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 8. Reports. (1) Each biennium,
18 the secretary of state shall provide, upon request, a report
19 to the legislature outlining the program's effectiveness in
20 achieving its objectives.

(2) Participating schools and agencies shall provide to
the secretary of state information regarding the youth
voting program for the secretary of state's report to the
legislature.
