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10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11 Section 1. Section 37-8-406, MCA, is amended to read: 12 *37-8-406. License --professional nursing --13 examination. (1) An applicant for a license to practice as a registered professional nurse is required to pass a written 14 15 examination in subjects the board determines necessary. A written examination may be supplemented by an oral or 16 practical examination. The board may use any national 17 18 standardized examination for professional nurse licensure 19 identified in its rules. The passing score on such 20 examination shall be established by the board in its rules. 21 On successfully passing the examination, an applicant shall 22 be issued a license to practice professional nursing.

(2) The board shall establish in its rules the
requirements for rewriting the examination for those persons
failing the examination on the first writing and subsequent





STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE Form BD-15

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0626, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to allow nurses from Canada to apply for a license to practice as a registered professional nurse in Montana without taking an English proficiency examination.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Approximately 50 applicants from Canada will apply for nursing licenses in the state of Montana each year.
- 2. Pursuant to the proposed amendments to 37-8-406, MCA, applicants who are English-speaking, registered nurses from Canada are not required to pass an English proficiency examination.
- 3. The Board of Nursing cannot use its national examination for Canadian applicants because it includes tests for English proficiency. Outside of the national examination, the Board of Nursing does not have the expertise to determine educational equivalency.
- 4. The Board of Nursing must contract the services of experts to determine the educational equivalency of Canadian nursing applicants at a cost of approximately \$80 per hour. Each applicant will take approximately two hours to evaluate.
- 5. Current law is represented by the executive budget recommendation for the Board of Nursing of the Dept. of Commerce.
