### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A bill to authorize a fee for late renewal of a license to engage in the business of cleaning septic tanks, cesspools, and privies; to allocate proceeds from late fees and the state's share of annual license fees to fund programs to enforce the laws regulating the business of cleaning septic tanks, cesspools, and privies.

### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The number of licenses issued will remain reasonably constant.
- 2. 50% of annual license renewals will be delinquent.
- 3. Secretary of State filing fees and printing associated with promulgation of rules would cost \$285 in FY92.
