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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

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12 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Short title. [Sections 1] through 5] may be cited as the "Montana Office of Rural 13 14 Health Act".

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Findings and purpose. The legislature finds that residents of rural areas of the state are increasingly faced with problems in accessing rural health care. The closure of small rural hospitals, the inability of rural areas to attract new physicians, the elimination of existing physician services because of increasing practice costs (including the cost of malpractice insurance), the nursing shortage in rural communities, and the decreasing economic vitality of some rural communities have all contributed to the problems of accessing health care that are experienced by rural residents. While Montana

- is not unique in experiencing these problems in rural 1
- communities, the need to maintain and enhance the economies
- of the state's rural areas requires that new and innovative
- 4 strategies be identified and implemented to respond to the
- 5 health care needs of rural Montana. It is the intent of the
- 6 legislature in enacting [sections 1 through 5] to create a
- 7 program to respond to these needs.
- NEW SECTION. Section 3. Office of 8 rural health
- 9 created. (1) There is an office of rural health within the
- 10 department.
- 11 (2) The department may work and contract with private
- 12 foundations, health associations, health care providers, the
- 13 state university system, and other interested public and
- 14 private organizations in order to carry out the duties of
- 15 the office pursuant to [section 4].
- NEW SECTION. Section 4. Duties of office. The office 16
- 17 of rural health shall:
- 18 (1) provide leadership and advocacy for rural residents
- 19 with regard to rural health care;
- 20 (2) assist rural areas of the state in accessing health
- 21 care:
- 22 (3) improve community involvement in delivery of rural
- 23 health care by methods that include the conduct of
- 24 leadership development programs for members

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(4) plan and assist in the recruitment and retention of health care professionals in rural areas:

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- (5) evaluate data on rural health conditions and needs;
- (6) identify federal and state programs concerning rural health and provide technical assistance to public and private, nonprofit entities regarding participation in those programs;
- (7) make recommendations to appropriate governmental private entities on improving the quality and cost-effectiveness of the delivery of rural health care;
- 11 (8) encourage the sharing of rural health care information: 12
  - (9) establish and maintain a clearinghouse for the collection and dissemination of information concerning rural health care issues and conduct research related to rural health care, including innovative approaches to the delivery of health care in rural areas:
  - (10) prepare and submit reports relating to its duties to the governor, the department of social and rehabilitation services, the department of family services, the department institutions. the department of commerce, the commissioner of higher education, and other appropriate state agencies; and
- 24 (11) coordinate its activities with the following 25 entities:

- 1 (a) federal, state, and local health care agencies and 2 private entities concerned with rural health care, including coordination for the purpose of avoiding duplication of activities;
- 5 (b) the Montana agricultural extension service, for the purposes of rural development activities;
  - (c) the federal office of rural health policy:
- 8 emergency medical services bureau of the 9 department, for the purpose of improving access to emergency 10 medical services in rural areas: and
- 11 (e) the Montana department of transportation, for the 12 purpose of improving access to health care in rural areas 13 through improved transportation and communication services.
- 14 NEW SECTION. Section 5. Funding limitations. 15 appropriated to the department for the purposes of [sections 16 1 through 41 may not be used for any of the following 17 purposes:
  - (1) the provision of health care;
- 19 (2) the purchase of medical equipment, ambulances, 20 aircraft, or other vehicles or to purchase major 21 communications equipment;
  - (3) the purchase or improvement of real property; or
- 23 (4) to carry out any activity requiring a certificate 24 of need.
- 25 NEW SECTION. Section 6. Appropriation. There

- 7 NEW SECTION. Section 7. Codification instruction.
- 8 [Sections 1 through 5] are intended to be codified as an
- 9 integral part of Title 50, chapter 5, and the provisions of
- Title 50, chapter 5, apply to [sections 1 through 5].
- 11 NEW SECTION. Section 8. Effective date. [This act] is
- 12 effective July 1, 1991.
