In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>HB0665</u>, as introduced.

### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to require school districts in certain counties to establish and implement earthquake emergency plans and procedures; and to advise school districts in other counties to establish such plans and procedures.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. There are 94 school districts in the counties listed in seismic risk zone 3.
- 2. All 56 counties have an emergency plan approved by their respective county government.
- 3. The Department of Military Affairs Disaster Coordination and Response Program staff prepare, update, coordinate and test all state emergency preparedness, response and recovery plans.
- 4. The division, working through four district representatives, provides coordination and operational, technical, administrative and training support for each county.
- 5. Operating 24 hours a day, seven days a week, the program staff coordinate and administer all state and federal response and recovery actions to any disaster beyond local governments' response and recovery capabilities.
- 6. No funds are provided to develop plans and programs for earthquake drills.
- 7. Costs would be borne at the district level and other natural disaster training would be designed at separate cost (for example, floods, blizzards, tornadoes).
- 8. This bill in section 1 (2)a, b, c, i, ii, iii identifies the parts of a required plan.
- 9. Costs for development, printing, training and distribution will depend on the size and scope of the plan.

## FISCAL IMPACT:

# EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUES OR EXPENDITURES:

Costs for the development, printing, training and distribution of the proposed program and plans would be borne by each of the 94 local school districts in seismic risk zone 3 listed section l(a). Some of the school district plans may be integrated with the 56 county plans already in place.
