In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0667, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to allow the Board of Medical Examiners to hire additional staff and fund any additional positions through an increase in the license fees paid by licensed physicians.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The Board of Medical Examiners needs an additional 1.00 FTE at a grade 13/step 2 due to current overloads in processing legal complaints and enforcement activities. The additional position would manage 65 complaints per year, process 26 investigations per year and assist with 13 contested cases per year.
- 2. The Professional and Occupational Licensing Bureau (POL Bureau) of the Department of Commerce will collect license fees and process applications, licenses, examinations, registry of licensees, administrative support for disciplinary procedures and board meetings. The additional services caused by the proposed legislation will require an additional 0.25 FTE. The increased administrative overhead cost must be reflected in the POL Bureau budget.
- 3. The additional position and associated costs will cause an \$8 increase in annual license fees. The Board of Medical Examiners has a registry of 4,466 licenses.
- 4. Current law is represented by the executive budget recommendation for the Board of Medical Examiners of the Department of Commerce.
