4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REMOVING THE
5 REQUIREMENT THAT THE BOARD OF COSMETOLOGISTS CONDUCT ANNUAL
6 INSPECTIONS; AMENDING SECTION 37-31-312, MCA."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9 **Section 1.** Section 37-31-312, MCA, is amended to read:

10 "37-31-312. Inspection. (1) The department shall
11 appoint one or more inspectors, each of whom shall devote
12 his time to inspecting beauty parlors and performing other
13 duties as the department may direct. The inspectors may
14 enter a beauty parlor, manicuring shop, booth, school of
15 cosmetology, or school of manicuring during business hours
16 for the purpose of inspection, and the refusal of a licensee
17 to permit the inspection during business hours is cause for
18 revocation of the license.

19 (2) Upon application for a license, any a
20 cosmetological establishment or manicuring shop must pay an
21 initial inspection fee prescribed by the board.

22 (3) The board may authorize the department to grant to
23 a cosmetological establishment or manicuring shop, upon
24 payment of the initial inspection fee, a temporary permit
25 authorizing the cosmetological establishment or manicuring

1 shop to operate for a period of not to exceed 90 days or
2 until the inspector is able to make the inspection,
3 whichever event occurs first. This temporary permit is not
4 renewable.

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0688, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act removing the requirement that the Board of Cosmetologists conduct annual inspections.


ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The goal of the board is to inspect all establishments twice per year.
2. The proposed workload will require 1.00 FTE inspector, grade 11, who will conduct 1,718 inspections per year. The average length of an inspection will be half an hour.
3. The inspector will travel 30,000 miles per year and spend 416 hours per year in the office. Based on current experience, travel cost will be approximately \$7 per inspection.
4. The Board of Cosmetologists has a sufficient fund balance to afford the proposed inspector and associated cost during the 1993 biennium. At the end of FY90, the Board of Cosmetologist had a fund balance of \$418,044.
5. Administrative overhead expenses associated with the proposed inspection program must be included in the budget for the Professional and Occupational Licensing Bureau of the Department of Commerce.
6. Current law is represented by the executive budget recommendation for the Board of Cosmetologists.
