Section 1. Beer license for brew pub. (1) Upon application and qualification, the department shall 12 13 issue a license, known as a brew pub license, to sell beer at retail for consumption upon brewery premises. 14 15 (2) To qualify for a brew pub license, the applicant: 16 (a) must be a brewery licensed under Title 16, chapter 17 3, part 2; 18 (b) must be located and manufacture beer only in 19 Montana; and (c) shall produce not more than 60,000 barrels of beer 20 21 a vear. 22 (3) A license issued under this section is not subject 23 to the provisions of 16-4-105. 24 (4) A brew pub license is valid only within the 25 premises of the licensed brewery. The holder of a brew pub

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license may sell beer at retail for on- and off-premises
 consumption. A brew pub licensee may sell any brand or type
 of beer regardless of where it is manufactured.

4 (5) The amount of the annual fee for a brew pub license
5 is the same as required for a beer retailer under 16-4-501.

6 (6) A brew pub license does not restrict in any manner 7 the lawful operations that the holder of the brewery license 8 is authorized by law to conduct.

9 Section 2. Section 16-3-213, MCA, is amended to read: 10 "16-3-213. Brewers or beer importers not to retail beer 11 -- original-package-and-tap-room exceptions. (1) It-shall-be 12 Except as provided in subsection (2), it is unlawful for any 13 brewer or breweries or beer importer to have or own any 14 permit to sell or retail beer at any place or premises, it 15 being the declared intention to prohibit brewers and beer 16 importers from engaging in the retail dispensation of beer; 17 provided, however,

18 (2) that-this-shall-not-be--so--construed--as--to This 19 section does not prohibit breweries:

20 (a) from making sale and delivery of beer manufactured 21 by them, in original packages, at either wholesale or 22 retail<sub>7</sub>-or;

23 (b) from providing, without charge, their products for 24 consumption on their licensed premises <u>as provided in</u> 25 16-3-214; or

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1	(c) from operating, on their premises, a brew pub

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## STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0740, as introduced.

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act creating brew pub licenses, and allowing a licensed Montana brewery with a production of not more than 60,000 barrels of beer a year to sell beer at retail within the premises of the brewery.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Currently there are 3 licensed breweries in Montana each of which produces no more than 60,000 barrels of beer a year and is part of a company that is located and manufactures beer only in Montana.
- 2. All 3 breweries apply for and are granted a brew pub license in FY92.
- 3. The fee for a Montana beer license is \$200 per year.
- 4. The total consumption of beer in Montana would not change as a result of these 3 additional beer licenses; therefore beer tax revenues would not change from current law estimates.
- 5. These 3 additional beer licenses would not be subject to current law beer license quotas, per the proposed legislation.
- 6. Annual license fees would be deposited in the state general fund.
