BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Calculation of total foundation program amount. The total foundation program amount for a district is calculated in the following manner:

- (1) determine the base foundation program amount in 20-9-316 through 20-9-321 for the appropriate school fiscal year by using the ANB of the district as calculated according to 20-9-311 for an elementary school or for a high school district; and
- (2) multiply the foundation program amount determined in subsection (1) by the appropriate factor in [section 2(2)] representing the teacher experience level calculated for the district for the previous school fiscal year.
- NEW SECTION. Section 2. Calculation of district
 teacher experience level factors representing teacher
 experience level. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
 following definitions apply:

- (a) "Teacher" means a person who:
- 2 (i) holds a valid Montana teacher certificate or 3 specialist certificate that has been issued under the 4 provisions of Title 20: and
- 5 (ii) is employed by a district as an instructional staff 6 member or as a specialist whose primary duties include 7 direct supervision of pupils rather than direct supervision 8 of other staff members.
- 9 (b) "Teacher experience" means the total credited
 10 experience of a teacher that a district acknowledges for the
 11 purposes of placement of the teacher on the adopted pay
 12 matrix of the district or as otherwise indicated by the
 13 district's written contract with the teacher.
- 14 (2) The trustees of a district shall determine the 15 teacher experience level and the teacher experience factor 16 to calculate the total foundation program amount for the 17 district under the provisions of [section 1], using the 18 following criteria:
- 19 (a) Level 1--A district with 65% or more of its 20 teachers having 3 years or less of credited experience is 21 assigned a teacher experience factor of 1.
- 22 (b) Level 2--A district with 35% or more of its 23 teachers having more than 3 years and not more than 7 years 24 of credited experience is assigned a teacher experience 25 factor of 1.16.

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0754, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to include a funding factor for the teacher experience level of a school district in the foundation program amount for the district; and providing a delayed effective date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Factors developed by LFA for HJR0016 study represent current district teacher experience.
- 2. HB0384 school equalization revenue estimates are used.
- 3. Current foundation program schedules are used.
- 4. Permissive GTB costs increase proportionately to the increase in schedules (a district budgeting a permissive of 35 percent of foundation will continue to do so with increased foundation).
- 5. The ratio of state cost of permissive GTB to total permissive GTB remains at FY91 level.
- 6. Executive budget estimates of the current level cost of Foundation and permissive GTB are used.
- 7. The act is effective beginning in FY93.
- 8. Other school expenditures including retirement GTB are not affected by the bill.
- 9. OPI will require .75 FTE administrative assistant grade 12 to process foundation program.

EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUES OR EXPENDITURES:

School districts will receive substantial increased state funding which may either be expended on additional educational costs or used to reduce local revenues in support of schools.

LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Districts may be expected to respond to the incentive to hire and keep experienced teachers with the result that more districts would qualify for the increased levels of aid. This response will increase the state cost.

TECHNICAL NOTES:

There is no provision for reporting of teacher experience factors to the Office of Public Instruction or their verification prior to the determination of the eligible level of foundation program funding.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Calculation of total foundation program amount. The total foundation program amount for a district is calculated in the following manner:

- (1) determine the base foundation program amount in 20-9-316 through 20-9-321 for the appropriate school fiscal year by using the ANB of the district as calculated according to 20-9-311 for an elementary school or for a high school district; and
- (2) multiply the foundation program amount determined in subsection (1) by the appropriate factor in (section 2(2)) representing the teacher experience level calculated for the district for the previous school fiscal year.
- <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Section 2.** Calculation of district teacher experience level -- factors representing teacher experience level. (1) For the purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:

- (a) "Teacher" means a person who:
- 2 (i) holds a valid Montana teacher certificate or 3 specialist certificate that has been issued under the 4 provisions of Title 20; and
- 5 (ii) is employed by a district as an instructional staff 6 member or as a specialist whose primary duties include 7 direct supervision of pupils rather than direct supervision 8 of other staff members.
- 9 (b) "Teacher experience" means the total credited
 10 experience of a teacher that a district acknowledges for the
 11 purposes of placement of the teacher on the adopted pay
 12 matrix of the district or as otherwise indicated by the
 13 district's written contract with the teacher.
- (2) The trustees of a district shall determine the teacher experience level and the teacher experience factor to calculate the total foundation program amount for the district under the provisions of [section 1], using the following criteria:
- 19 (a) Level 1--A district with 65% or more of its
 20 teachers having 3 years or less of credited experience is
 21 assigned a teacher experience factor of 1.
- 22 (b) Level 2--A district with 35% or more of its 23 teachers having more than 3 years and not more than 7 years 24 of credited experience is assigned a teacher experience 25 factor of 1.16.

SECOND READING

- 1 (c) Level 3--A district with more than 65% of its 2 teachers having more than 7 years of credited experience is 3 assigned a teacher experience factor of 1.27.
- 4 (3) The trustees of the district shall report the 5 following to the county superintendent in the manner 6 provided for school district budget reporting in this title:
- 7 (a) the district's calculated teacher experience level
 8 for the previous school fiscal year; and
- 9 (b) all documentation used by the district in 10 calculating the teacher experience level for the district.
