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RELATING TO CERTIFICATION OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIANS; 7 AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS TO ADOPT RULES 8 ESTABLISHING VARIOUS LEVELS OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN 9 CERTIFICATION AND PRESCRIBING THE TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION 10 REQUIREMENTS FOR EACH LEVEL, AS WELL AS THE TYPES OF 11 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES EACH MAY PERFORM; AMENDING 12 SECTIONS 50-6-202, 50-6-203, AND 50-6-207, MCA; REPEALING 13 SECTIONS 50-6-204 AND 50-6-205, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN 14 IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE." 15

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#### STATEMENT OF INTENT

A statement of intent is required for this bill because 18 [section 2] gives the board of medical examiners authority 19 to adopt rules specifying various certification levels for 20 emergency medical technicians and requires the board to 21 certification, and performance training. 22 establish requirements for each level of certification. It is the 23 intent of the legislature that the board define several 24 certification levels for emergency medical technicians, 25

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which will differ in the amount of training required and in the acts allowed to be performed. It is also intended that the board specify the training needed by each level, the acts and procedures each level is allowed to perform, the standards that must be met to be certified and recertified at each level, and procedural requirements necessary to enforce and implement certification and training.

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9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
10 Section 1. Section 50-6-202, MCA, is amended to read:
11 "50-6-202. Definitions. As used in this part, the

12 following definitions apply:

13 (1) "Emergency medical technician--basic" means 14 personnel-of-volunteer-or-nonvolunteer-police7-fire7-rescue7 15 ambulance;--or-emergency-services a person who have has been 16 specially trained in emergency care in a training program 17 approved by the state board of medical examiners and certified by said the board as having demonstrated a level 18 19 of competence suitable to treat victims of injury or other 20 emergent condition.

6 Section 2. Section 50-6-203, MCA, is amended to read: 7 \*50-6-203. Rules. (1) The board, after consultation 8 with the department of health and environmental sciences, 9 the department of justice, and other appropriate 10 departments, associations, and organizations, shall adopt 11 rules of the board implementing this part, including but not 12 limited to training and certification of personnely 13 emergency medical technicians and administration of drugs, 14 and-other-acts-as-allowed-herein.

15 (2) The board may, by rule, establish various levels of 16 emergency medical technician certification and shall specify 17 for each level the training requirements, acts allowed, 18 recertification requirements, and any other requirements 19 regarding the training, performance, or certification of 20 that level of emergency medical technician that it considers 21 necessary or desirable."

"50-6-207. Construction. Nothing in this part shall be
construed to detract from the powers granted to the
department of health and environmental sciences to regulate

## In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0881, as introduced.

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act revising the laws relating to certification of emergency medical technicians; authorizing the Board of Medical Examiners to adopt rules establishing various levels of emergency medical technician certification and prescribing the training and certification requirements for each level, as well as the types of emergency medical services each may perform; amending sections 50-6-202, 50-6-203, and 50-6-207, MCA; repealing sections 50-6-204 and 50-6-205, MCA; and providing an immediate effective date.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The Emergency Medical Services Bureau of the Department of Health and Environmental Sciences currently administers the EMT certification process on behalf of the Montana Board of Medical Examiners.
- 2. Since no new certification levels are contemplated, there will be no fiscal impact on the Department of Health and Environmental Sciences or the Board of Medical Examiners.
- 3. Adoption of rules by the Board of Medical Examiners would be a cost absorbed in the recommended board budget.
