A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO REVISE THE MONTANA CHILD CARE ACT; TO CONTINUE THE STATE GRANT PROGRAM FOR LOCAL CHILD-CARE RESOURCE AND REFERRAL PROGRAMS; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY SERVICES TO APPLY FOR FEDERAL GRANTS TO IMPROVE CHILD-CARE LICENSING AND REGISTRATION AND TO MONITOR CHILD-CARE PROVIDED TO CHILDREN RECEIVING AID TO FAMILIES WITH DEPENDENT CHILDREN; PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION; REPEALING SECTION 52-2-712, MCA, AND SECTION 18, CHAPTER 692, LAWS OF 1989; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Application for federal grants. The department shall apply for federal grants as authorized under 42 U.S.C. 602(g)(6) to:

(1) improve child-care licensing and registration requirements and procedures in this state; and

(2) monitor child-care provided to children receiving aid to families with dependent children.

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Repealer. Section 52-2-712, MCA, and section 18, Chapter 692, Laws of 1989, are IS repealed.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Appropriation. There are appropriated from the general fund to the department of family services for the biennium ending June 30, 1993, the following sums of money:

(1) \$120,000 to fund the state match for services provided by local child-care resource and referral programs in arranging child care for participants in the job opportunities and basic skills (JOBS) training program ALL FEDERALLY SUPPORTED, STATE-OPERATED DAY-CARE PROGRAMS;

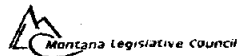
(2) \$100,000 to fund grants for local child-care resource and referral programs;

(3) \$240,000 to fund 8 FTE to provide licensing and registration of day-care facilities.

NEW SECTION. Section 4. Codification. Instruction (Section 1) is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 52, Chapter 2, Part 7, and the provisions of Title 52, Chapter 2, Part 7, apply to (Section 1).
