A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING AN URBAN REFORESTATION GRANT PROGRAM; ESTABLISHING AN URBAN REFORESTATION SPECIAL REVENUE ACCOUNT; PROVIDING RULEMAKING AUTHORITY; PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

#### STATEMENT OF INTENT

A statement of intent is required for this bill in order to provide guidance to the department of state lands in adopting rules to administer the urban reforestation grant program provided for under [section 1(4)]. It is the intent of the legislature that the grants under this program be made available to local governments for the purpose of purchasing trees to reforest Montana's cities and towns. The costs associated with planting the trees are not covered by this program.

The grants are to be made available to any local government in the state and are to be awarded by the department biennially on a competitive basis. A single grant may not exceed \$20,000. Criteria for awarding the grants are to be determined by the department and should include but are not limited to a demonstrated need for reforestation and



financial assistance to accomplish reforestation.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Urban reforestation account -purpose. (1) There is an urban reforestation account in the
state special revenue fund provided for in 17-2-102.

- (2) There must be deposited in the account:
- (a) the appropriation provided for in [section 3];
- (b) money received by the department of state lands in the form of legislative appropriations, reimbursements, gifts, federal funds, or appropriations from any source intended to be used for the purposes of this account.
- (3) Money in the account is available to the department for the uses set forth in subsection (4). Any unencumbered and unexpended balance of this account remaining at the end of a fiscal year does not lapse but must be carried forward for the purposes of this section until expended or appropriated.
- (4) Money in the account must be used by the department to fund an urban reforestation grant program to local governments for the purpose of reforesting Montana's cities and towns.
- NEW SECTION. Section 2. Rulemaking. The department of state lands may adopt rules to implement the urban reforestation grant program provided for in [section 1(4)].

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the net earnings accruing to the resource indemnity trust fund provided for in 15-38-201 to the urban reforestation account provided for in [section 1] \$100,000 in fiscal year 1992 and \$100,000 in fiscal year 1993.

NEW SECTION. Section 4. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 1991.

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

An act establishing an urban reforestation grant program; establishing an urban reforestation special revenue account; providing rulemaking authority; providing an appropriation; and providing an effective date.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Interest earnings for the Resource Indemnity Trust will be \$7,953,000 in FY92 and \$8,605,000 in FY93 (OBPP).
- 2. The distribution of the interest earnings of the Resource Indemnity Trust for the FY92-93 biennium, according to current law, will be: \$175,000 to the environmental contingency account and \$50,000 to the oil and gas production damage mitigation account, with 30% of the remainder allocated to the water development account, 12% of the remainder to the hazardous waste/CERCLA account, 8% of the remainder to the renewable resource development account, 46% of the remainder to the reclamation and development grants account, and 4% of the remainder to the environmental quality protection fund (MCA 15-38-202).
