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A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA REQUESTING THE BOARD OF REGENTS TO DEVELOP A QUANTITATIVE SYSTEM FOR EVALUATING CURRENT SPACE UTILIZATION AND ASCERTAINING FUTURE SPACE NEEDS WITHIN THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM.

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WHEREAS, providing an adequate physical environment in which the activities of higher education may be conducted is a responsibility of the citizens of Montana; and

WHEREAS, methods exist that can quantitatively determine the facility needs of the university system.

That the Board of Regents develop and maintain a quantitative method of evaluating current space utilization and analyzing future space needs at each unit of the university system to generate information that will aid the

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
