WHEREAS, certain research by the Office of the Secretary of State indicates that a number of individuals do not register to vote to avoid being placed on lists for jury duty; and

WHEREAS, jury lists or pools should be representative of the entire community to ensure that a person having a matter heard before a jury is being judged by a jury of his peers; and

WHEREAS, state agencies and local government may be able to develop other necessary or helpful statistical information by combining various lists of individuals.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

(1) That state agencies and local government units, including but not limited to the Secretary of State, the Department of Justice, District Court Clerks, Clerks and Recorders, and Justices of the Peace, work together to develop a plan for creating a system to combine various lists of individuals, including but not limited to voter lists, drivers' license lists, and motor vehicle registration lists.

(2) That the state agencies and local government units strive to have a plan, including proposed costs, developed in time to present to the 1993 Montana Legislature.

(3) That all state agencies and local government units have access to the combined list to create jury pools and to compile other statistical information that may be necessary or helpful to the state agency or local government unit.
