BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

8 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Meal and rest periods for 9 employees. (1) Each employer shall provide at least a half 10 hour lunch period not later than 5 hours after the beginning 11 of the employee's workday.

- (2) Each employer shall provide at least a 10-minute rest period every 2 1/2 consecutive hours worked by each employee.
- (3) An employer who fails, neglects, or refuses to provide meal or rest periods, as provided in this section, or who permits an overseer, superintendent, or agent to violate the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, is subject to a fine not to exceed \$500 for each offense.
- NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction.

  39, chapter 2, part 2, apply to [section 1].
