A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING AN OFFICE

- 5 OF THE STATE COORDINATOR FOR ETHNIC AFFAIRS: DEFINING THE
- 6 DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE COORDINATOR FOR ETHNIC
- AFFAIRS: AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE." 7

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
- 10 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Legislative findings. The
- 11 legislature of the state of Montana finds that:
- 12 (1) many ethnic minorities in this state are confronted
- 13 by problems such as unemployment, underemployment, and the
- 14 lack of economic and educational opportunity;
- 15 (2) the problems facing ethnic minorities are
- 16 perpetuated because there has been no concerted or faithful
- 17 effort to eliminate the factors contributing to undesirable
- 18 social and economic conditions for ethnic minorities in the
- 19 state; and
- 20 (3) there is a need to increase the awareness of both
- 21 the public and private sectors in order to address the
- 22 current problems and conditions confronting ethnic
- 23 minorities in Montana.
- NEW SECTION. Section 2. Declaration of legislative 24
- 25 purpose. Consistent with the findings stated in [section 1],

- the legislature declares that it is the purpose of [sections
- 1 through 71 to assist and enable ethnic minorities to take
- 3 their rightful place in society.
- NEW SECTION. Section 3. Definitions. For purposes of
- (sections 1 through 7], unless the context requires
- otherwise, the following definitions apply:
- 7 (1) "Coordinator for ethnic affairs" means the person
- appointed by the governor to serve in the office of the
- state coordinator for ethnic affairs as provided in [section
- 10 5].
- 11 (2) "Ethnic minority" means a person of Hispanic,
- 12 Black, Asian, or other minority race.
- 13 NEW SECTION. Section 4. Office of state coordinator
- 14 for ethnic affairs. (1) There is an office of the state
- 15 coordinator for ethnic affairs.
- 16 (2) The office is attached to the department of
- 17 commerce for administrative purposes only as provided in
- 18 2-15-121.
- 19 NEW SECTION. Section 5. Appointment ο£ state
- 20 coordinator. (1) The governor shall appoint the coordinator
- for ethnic affairs from a list of qualified ethnic 21
- 22 minorities that must include the names of persons submitted
- 23 by organizations representing ethnic minorities in the
- 24 state.
- 25 (2) The governor shall the salary of the

- 1 coordinator for ethnic affairs.
- NEW SECTION. Section 6. Term -- vacancy in office. (1)
- 3 The coordinator for ethnic affairs shall serve a term of 4
- 4 years and may be reappointed by the governor for additional
- 5 terms.
- 6 (2) A vacancy in the office must be filled in the same 7 manner as the original appointment.
- 8 NEW SECTION. Section 7. Duties and responsibilities.
- 9 The coordinator for ethnic affairs shall:
- 10 (1) acquaint himself with the problems confronting
- 11 ethnic minorities in Montana;
- 12 (2) focus attention on the problems of ethnic
- 13 minorities in the state in order to foster better
- 14 understanding and concern for the problems of ethnic
- 15 minorities;
- 16 (3) inform the governor and the legislature of the
- 17 problems of ethnic minorities and recommend ways to address
- 18 these problems;
- 19 (4) serve as a representative for ethnic minorities in
- 20 all matters of state government of special concern to ethnic
- 21 minorities in the state; and
- 22 (5) carry out any other responsibilities consistent
- with the purpose of [sections 1 through 7].
- 24 NEW SECTION. Section 8. Codification instruction.
- 25 [Sections 1 through 7] are intended to be codified as an

- 1 integral part of Title 53, chapter 8, and the provisions of
- Title 53, chapter 8, apply to [sections 1 through 7].
- 3 NEW SECTION. Section 9. Effective date. [This act] is
- 4 effective July 1, 1991.

#### STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

#### Form BD-15

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB0076, as introduced.

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act establishing an Office of the State Coordinator for Ethnic Affairs; defining the duties and responsibilities of the coordinator for ethnic affairs; and providing an effective date.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The proposed Office of the State Coordinator for Ethnic Affairs would perform an advocacy role similar to the Office of the State Coordinator of Indian Affairs.
- 2. The proposed Office of the State Coordinator for Ethnic Affairs will require the same number of FTE and operating expenses as represented in the executive budget recommendation for the Office of the State Coordinator of Indian Affairs. Personal service costs in FY92 consist of one exempt position at a salary of \$34,262 in FY92 and \$34,131 in FY93 plus one position at a grade 12 step 2 for a salary of \$19,381 in FY92 and \$19,308 in FY93. Benefits in FY92 are figured at 14.95% for a cost of \$8,020 and at 15.13% in FY93 for a cost of \$8,085. State health insurance costs are \$3,600 for each of the fiscal
- 3. The initial equipment expenses will be approximately \$10,000 during the first year of operation.
- 4. Although the Department of Commerce currently does not have office space available for an Office of the State Coordinator for Ethnic Affairs, the coordinator for ethnic affairs is assumed to locate office space at the prevailing state rate.

SB 76
