Senate BILL NO. 96 INTRODUCED BY But 2 3 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT EARMARKING A PORTION OF 4 5 THE LOTTERY REVENUE TO COUNTY GOVERNMENTS FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT: AMENDING SECTIONS 23-5-1007 AND 23-5-1027, MCA; 6 AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE." 7

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 9

Section 1. Section 23-5-1027, MCA, is amended to read: 10 "23-5-1027. Disposition of revenue. (1) A minimum of 11 12 45% of the money paid for tickets or chances must be paid 13 as prize money. The prize money is statutorily out appropriated, as provided in 17-7-502, to the lottery. 14

15 (2) Commissions paid to lottery ticket or chance sales 16 agents are not a state lottery operating expense.

17 (3) That part of all gross revenue not used for the 18 payment of prizes, commissions, and operating expenses, 19 together with the interest earned on the gross revenue while 20 the gross revenue is in the enterprise fund, is net revenue 21 and must be paid quarterly from the enterprise fund 22 established by 23-5-1026 in the following manner:

23 (a) 10% of the net revenue generated in each county to

24 that county for use in economic development; and

25 (b) the remainder of the net revenue to the

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1 superintendent of public instruction for distribution as 2 state equalization aid to the public schools of Montana, as 3 provided in 20-9-343. 4 (4) The net revenue is statutorily appropriated, as provided in 17-7-5027--to--the--superintendent--of--public 5 6 instruction. 7 (4)(5) The spending authority of the lottery may be 8 increased in accordance with this section upon review and g approval of a revised operation plan by the budget office." Section 2. Section 23-5-1007, MCA, is amended to read: 10 31 "23-5-1007. Powers and duties of commission. The 12 commission shall: 13 (1) establish and operate a state lottery and may not 14 become involved in any other gambling or gaming; 15 (2) determine policies for the operation of the state 16 lottery, supervise the director and his staff, and meet with 17 the director at least once every 3 months to make and 18 consider recommendations, set policies, determine types and forms of lottery games to be operated by the state lottery, 19 20 and transact other necessary business; 21 (3) maximize the net revenue paid to counties and the 22 superintendent of public instruction under 23-5-1027 and 23 ensure that all policies and rules adopted further revenue 24 maximization:

(4) subject to 23-5-1927(1), determine the percentage



1 of the money paid for tickets or chances to be paid out as
2 prizes;

3 (5) determine the price of each ticket or chance and
4 the number and size of prizes;

5 (6) provide for the conduct of drawings of winners of 6 lottery games;

7 (7) carry out, with the director, a continuing study of
8 the state lotteries of Montana and other states to make the
9 state lottery more efficient, profitable, and secure from
10 violations of the law;

11 (8) study and may enter into agreements with other 12 lottery states to offer lottery games;

13 (9) prepare guarterly and annual reports on all aspects of the operation of the state lottery, including but not 14 15 limited to types of games, gross revenue, prize money paid, operating expenses, net revenue to the state, contracts with 16 17 gaming suppliers, and recommendations for changes to this 18 part, and deliver a copy of each report to the governor, the department of administration, the legislative auditor, the 19 president of the senate, the speaker of the house of 20 21 representatives, and each member of the appropriate 22 committee of each house of the legislature as determined by 23 the president of the senate and the speaker of the house; 24 and

25 (10) adopt rules relating to lottery staff sales

- 1 incentives or bonuses and sales agents' commissions and any
- 2 other rules necessary to carry out this part."
- 3 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date. [This act] is
- 4 effective July 1, 1991.
