# STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE Form BD-15

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB0109, as introduced.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act requiring agencies of state government to use gasohol in state vehicles; and requiring records to be kept of the use of gasohol in state vehicles.

### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Section 1 would require state agencies to use gasohol if the price of gasohol is no more than \$.10 per gallon greater than the price for motor vehicle fuel otherwise used by the vehicle.
- 2. The current law price of gasoline is approximately \$1.25 per gallon. A \$.10 per gallon increase in the current law price of gasoline represents an 8% percent increase in cost.
- 3. Current law is represented by FY90 actual expenditures for gasoline by all state agencies and higher education.
- 4. Recordkeeping requirements may increase the operational cost of some state agencies. However, some state agencies are capable of incorporating the recordkeeping requirements into existing management information systems without any increase in cost. The overall effect of the proposed recordkeeping requirements would be minimal and/or indeterminable.
- 5. Vehicles incapable of using gasohol are exempt from the provisions of the proposed law. The proposed requirements will have no effect on current or projected expenditures by state agencies for vehicle maintenance.

## LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

The use of gasohol by state agencies would impact the production of gasohol in Montana. An increase in the production of gasohol would increase the tax incentive payments for gasohol production. In FY90, \$360,000 in gasohol production tax incentives were paid. Gasohol incentives are scheduled to be terminated on July 1, 1993.
