As 21 required in that rule, the board of public education shall 22 provide that an approved variance is granted for 1 year and 23 is renewable for an additional 5 years without annual 24 approval if both the school district and the board of public 25

education find the 1-year pilot to be workable and educationally sound.

It is the intent of the legislature that the board of public education limit for the first 2 years of implementation the number of districts that may be approved for this variance.

7 It is also the intent of the legislature that the 8 superintendent of public instruction amend rules related to 9 the equitable distribution of state, county, and federal 0 school funds to a district that is granted a variance under 1 [this act].
