In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB0175, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act excepting engineering and maintenance personnel in professional and management positions in the Department of Highways from the statewide pay plan; amending section 2-18-103, MCA; and providing an effective date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Salaries would be increased relative to market salaries in Montana and the surrounding region for comparable positions.

 The department will increase salaries approximately 10% in FY92 and approximately 10% in FY93.
- 2. Currently positions with wage/salary grades 15 and below charge 100% of their time to federal participating projects. Positions with wage/salary grade 16 charge 50% of their time to federal participating projects. Positions with wage/salary grades 17 and above do not charge any of their time to federal participating projects. The average federal participation is 80%.
- 3. Cost of living increases are not included in estimated wage/salary increase.
