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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 61-10-104, MCA, is amended to read:

"61-10-104. Length -- definitions. (1) A single truck,

14 bus, or any self-propelled vehicle, unladen or with load,

15 may not have an overall length, inclusive of front and rear

16 bumpers, in excess of 40 45 feet.

(2) (a) When used in a truck tractor-semitrailer combination, the semitrailer may not exceed 53 feet in length, excluding those portions not designed to carry a load, except as provided by 61-10-124. When used in a truck tractor-semitrailer-trailer or a truck tractor-semitrailer-semitrailer combination, the semitrailer and trailer or the two semitrailers may not exceed 28 1/2 feet each in length, excluding those portions not designed to carry a load, except as provided by 61-10-124. Truck

- 1 tractor-semitrailer, truck tractor-semitrailer-trailer, and
- 2 truck tractor-semitrailer-semitrailer combinations, other
- 3 than a turnpike double, are not subject to an-overall a
  - combination length limit.
- 5 (b) A stinger-steered automobile or boat transporter
- 6 may not exceed 75 feet in length plus a maximum 3 feet of
- 7 front overhang and 4 feet of rear overhang except as
- provided by 61-10-124. "Stinger-steered automobile or boat
- 9 transporter" means a truck tractor-semitrailer combination
- 10 that has a fifth wheel on a drop frame located behind and
- 11 below the rear axle of the truck tractor and that is
- 12 designed and used for the transportation of vehicles or
- 13 assembled boats or boat hulls.
- 14 (c) All other combinations of vehicles may not have an
- 15 overall a combination length, -inclusive-of-front-and-rear
- 16 bumpers, in excess of 75 feet, except as provided by
  - 61-10-124. If the combination consists of more than two
- 18 units, the rear units of the combination shall be equipped
- 19 with breakaway brakes.

- 20 (3) A motor vehicle may not tow more than one motor
- 21 vehicle, and a motor vehicle may not draw more than three
- 22 motor vehicles attached to it by the triple saddle-mount
- 23 method (that is, by mounting the front wheels of one vehicle
- on the bed of another, leaving only the rear wheels of the
- 25 vehicle in contact with the roadway), nor may this

combination have an-overall a combination length, --inclusive of-front-and-rear-bumpers, in excess of 65 feet.

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- (4) A passenger vehicle or truck of less than 2,000 pounds "manufacturers' rated capacity" may not tow more than one trailer or semitrailer, nor may this combination have an overall a length;—inclusive—of-front—and—rear—bumpers; in excess of 65 feet.
- 8 (5) As used in this chapter, the following definitions
  9 apply:
  - (a) "Combination length" means the total length of a combination of vehicles, such as a truck tractor-semitrailer-trailer combination, measured from the front bumper of the motor vehicle to the back bumper or rear extremity of the last trailer, including the connection tongues.
    - (b) "Combined trailer length" means the total length of a combination of trailers measured from the front of the first trailer to the back of the last trailer, including the connection tongues.
    - (c) "Length" means the total longitudinal dimension of a single vehicle, a trailer, or a semitrailer. The length of a trailer or semitrailer is measured from the front of the cargo-carrying unit to its rear, exclusive of safety or energy efficiency devices, air-conditioning units, air compressors, flexible fender extensions, splash and spray

- suppressant devices, bolsters, mechanical fastening devices,
  and hydraulic lift gates.
- 3 (d) "Rocky mountain double" means a combination of
  4 vehicles that includes a truck tractor pulling a long
  5 semitrailer and a shorter trailer.
- 6 (e) "Turnpike double" means a combination of vehicles
  7 that includes a truck tractor pulling a long semitrailer and
  8 an additional long trailer."
- 9 Section 2. Section 61-10-124, MCA, is amended to read:
- "61-10-124. Special permits -- fee -- cranes. (1) As used in this section, "crane" means a self-propelled single-unit vehicle consisting of not more than four axles and used for raising, shifting, and lowering heavy weights by means of a projecting swinging arm.
- 15 (2) Except as provided in subsections (3)(b), (3)(d), 16 and (6), in addition to the regular registration and gross vehicle weight fees, a fee of \$10 for each trip permit and a 17 18 fee of \$75 for each term permit issued for size and weight 19 in excess of that specified in 61-10-101 through 61-10-110 20 must be paid for all movements under special permits on the 21 public highways under the jurisdiction of the department of 22 highways.
  - (3) (a) Except as provided in subsections (3)(b),
- 24 (3)(d), and (6), term or blanket permits may not be issued
- 25 for an overwidth vehicle, combination of mehicles, load, or

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other thing in excess of 15 feet; an overlength vehicle, 1 2 combination of vehicles, load, object, or other thing in 3 excess of 95 feet; and an overheight vehicle, combination of vehicles, load, or other thing in excess of 14 feet, or of a 4 5 limit determined by the department. A vehicle, combination of vehicles, load, or other thing in excess of these 6 7 dimensions is limited to trip permits. A rocky mountain double may not exceed 81 feet in combined trailer length, 8 9 the long semitrailer cargo unit of the combination may not 10 exceed 48 feet in length, and the shorter cargo unit may not 11 exceed 28 1/2 feet in length. A rocky mountain double is not subject to a combination length limit. Special permits for 12 13 vehicle combinations of more than two trailers or more than two units designed for or used to carry a load are not 14 15 permitted except as provided in subsection (6). Special 16 permits for vehicle combinations may specify and special 17 permits under subsection (6) must specify highway routing 18 and otherwise limit or prescribe conditions of operation of 19 the vehicle or combination, including but not limited to 20 required equipment, speed, stability, operational procedures, and insurance. 21

(b) A term permit may be issued to a dealer in implements of husbandry and self-propelled machinery for an overwidth or overlength vehicle referred to in subsection (3)(a). The fee for this permit is \$75. This permit covers a

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period of 1 year and expires on December 31 of each year with no grace period.

- (c) With payment of the appropriate gross weight fee fees required by 61-10-203 61-10-201 and 61-10-202 and with payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (2), allowable gross weight of a five-axle combination logging vehicle is 80,000 pounds.
- (d) A term permit may be issued for any-combination-of vehicles a turnpike double that exceeds-95--feet--in--length but does not exceed 100 110 feet in combination length, except----a----truck-trailer-trailer----or----a----truck tractor-semitrailer-trailer-trailer-combination,-for-travel only-on-highways-that-are-part-of-the-federal-aid-interstate system; -as-defined-in-60-1-103; -or-on-other-highways--within a--2-mile--radius-of-an-interchange-on-the-interstate-system in-order-to-obtain-necessary-services-or-to-load--or--unload at--a--terminal:--When-a-terminal-is-beyond-a-2-mile-radius; the-department-may-authorize-travel-between-the-terminal-and the-interchange--The-fee-for-this-permit-is-\$125. A turnpike double may not exceed 110 feet in combination length and an individual cargo unit of the combination may not exceed 45 feet in length. The combination of vehicles composing a turnpike double must comply with the provisions of subsection (6) except the length limit in subsection (6)(d).

(4) Except as provided in subsection (3)(b), a permit

- 1 may not be issued for a period of time greater than the
- 2 period for which the GVW license is valid as provided in
- 3 this title, including grace periods allowed by this title.
- 4 Owners of vehicles licensed in other jurisdictions may, at
- 5 the discretion of the department of highways, purchase
- 6 permits to expire with their registration. A license
- 7 required by the state governs the issuance of a special
- 8 permit.

- 9 (5) The owner or operator of a crane with a gross
- 10 vehicle weight of less than 80,000 pounds may purchase a
- 11 30-day special permit for overweight if the crane has a
- 12 current special mobile equipment identification plate and if
- 13 the department of highways has approved the configuration of
- 14 the crane through a weight analysis completed within the
- 15 same calendar year. The permit is not transferable, and the
- 16 fee for the permit is \$200.
- 17 (6) The department may issue special permits to the
  - operating company for a truck-trailer-trailer or truck
- 19 tractor-semitrailer-trailer-trailer combination of vehicles
- 20 under the following conditions:
- 21 (a) the combination may be operated only on highways
- 22 that are part of the federal-aid interstate system as
- 23 defined in 60-1-103 and within a 2-mile radius of an
- 24 interchange on the interstate system on other highways only
- 25 in order to obtain necessary services or to load or unload

- 1 at a terminal. When a terminal is beyond a 2-mile radius,
- 2 the department may authorize travel between the terminal and
- 3 the interchange.
- 4 (b) a combination of vehicles powered by a cab-over
  - (tilt cab) type truck-tractor or a truck may not exceed
- 6 overall length of 105 feet, inclusive of front and rear
- 7 bumpers and overhang;
- 8 (c) a combination of vehicles powered by a conventional
- 9 truck-tractor may not exceed overall length of 110 feet,
- 10 inclusive of front and rear bumpers and overhang;
- 11 (d) no individual cargo unit of the combination may
- exceed 28 1/2 feet in length and 102 inches in width;
- 13 (e) gross weight fees under 61-10-203 must be paid on
- 14 the truck or truck tractor for the declared registered gross
- 15 weight of the special vehicle combination, but not to exceed
- 16 the formula in 61-10-107;
- 17 (f) the combination must have a restricted route permit
- under 61-10-107(3) and a special overlength permit issued at
- 19 a fee of \$200 for a term permit or \$20 for each trip permit;
- 20 (g) travel of the combination may be restricted to
- 21 specific routes, hours of operation, specific days, or
- 22 seasonal periods; and
- 23 (h) the department may enforce any other restrictions
- 24 determined by the department to be necessary. The permit is
- not transferable, and the fee for the permit is \$200."

13	A STATEMENT OF INTENT IS REQUIRED FOR THIS BILL BECAUSE
14	61-10-129 GRANTS RULEMAKING AUTHORITY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
15	HIGHWAYS. IT IS THE INTENT OF THE LEGISLATURE THAT THE
16	RULES ADOPTED FOR TURNPIKE DOUBLES INCLUDE ALL THE RULES
17	ADOPTED FOR THE OPERATION OF TRIPLE TRAILERS. IN ADDITION,
18	IT IS INTENDED THAT THE DEPARTMENT AUDIT ALL INTERCHANGES
19	AND RESTRICT ACCESS ROUTES ON AND OFF THE INTERSTATE SYSTEM

- (b) a combination of vehicles powered by a cab-over (tilt cab) type truck-tractor or a truck may not exceed overall length of 105 feet, inclusive of front and rear bumpers and overhang;
- (c) a combination of vehicles powered by a conventional truck-tractor may not exceed overall length of 110 feet,

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inclusive of front and rear bumpers and overhang;

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- 2 (d) no individual cargo unit of the combination may
  3 exceed 28 1/2 feet in length and 102 inches in width;
  - (e) gross weight fees under 61-10-203 must be paid on the truck or truck tractor for the declared registered gross weight of the special vehicle combination, but not to exceed the formula in 61-10-107;
  - (f) the combination must have a restricted route permit under 61-10-107(3) and a special overlength permit issued at a fee of \$200 for a term permit or \$20 for each trip permit;
  - (g) travel of the combination may be restricted to specific routes, hours of operation, specific days, or seasonal periods; and
  - (h) the department may enforce any other restrictions determined by the department to be necessary. The permit is not transferable, and the fee for the permit is \$200."

  - (e) gross weight fees under 61-10-203 must be paid on the truck or truck tractor for the declared registered gross weight of the special vehicle combination, but not to exceed the formula in 61-10-107;
  - (f) the combination must have a restricted route permit under 61-10-107(3) and a special overlength permit issued at a fee of \$200 for a term permit or \$20 for each trip permit;
- 24 (g) travel of the combination may be restricted to
  25 specific routes, hours of operation, specific days, or

l seasonal periods; and

2 (h) the department may enforce any other restrictions 3 determined by the department to be necessary. The permit is 4 not transferable, and the fee for the permit is \$200."
