## STATEMENT OF INTENT

A STATEMENT OF INTENT IS REQUIRED FOR THIS BILL BECAUSE 61-10-129 GRANTS RULEMAKING AUTHORITY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAYS. IT IS THE INTENT OF THE LEGISLATURE THAT THE RULES ADOPTED FOR TURNPIKE DOUBLES INCLUDE ALL THE RULES ADOPTED FOR THE OPERATION OF TRIPLE TRAILERS. IN ADDITION, IT IS INTENDED THAT THE DEPARTMENT AUDIT ALL INTERCHANGES AND RESTRICT ACCESS ROUTES ON AND OFF THE INTERSTATE SYSTEM BY TURNPIKE DOUBLES AS A RESULT OF THE DEPARTMENT'S ASSESSMENT OF INTERCHANGES AND ROUTES TO THE INTERCHANGES TO BE FOLLOWED.
