INTRODUCED BY THE THE BILL NO. 184

A BELL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING REQUIREMENTS FOR HIGHWAY DIRECTION AND DISTANCE SIGNS; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. **Section 1.** Cities shown on highway direction and distance signs. If the department erects, repairs, or replaces a direction or distance sign on a public highway included in the state maintenance system designated under 60-2-105, the sign must state:

- (1) if a direction sign, the nearest city on the highway with a population of 10,000 or more if that city is nearer than a control city designated in the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices adopted by the commission; and
- (2) if a distance sign, three cities or towns, if three cities or towns exist on the highway, including a city with a population of 10,000 or more located on the highway nearer than a control city designated in the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices adopted by the commission.
- NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction.

- 2 60, chapter 2, part 2, apply to [section 1].
- 3 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date. [This act] is
