In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB0219, as introduced.

## **DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:**

This bill revises the law regarding shooting preserves by removing the 10-mile restriction on preserve locations and establishing a flat fee for shooting preserve licenses or permits.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- There are 26 licensed shooting preserves as of December 31, 1990
- These 26 preserves paid \$2,780 in fees depending on size of the preserve. The average fee was \$110.
- Assume 5 preserves will not relicense because they are not operating preserves; they only license to protect their rights under the 10-mile limit.
- 4. Assume 5 more preserves will be licensed statewide because of the elimination of the 10-mile restriction.
