A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING A PILOT PROJECT TO PROVIDE REIMBURSEMENT OF MEDICAID DENTAL SERVICES THROUGH THE USE OF VOUCHERS: PROVIDING FOR ADMINISTRATION OF THE PILOT PROJECT: AUTHORIZING A TAX CREDIT FOR DENTISTS WHO ACCEPT VOUCHERS AS PAYMENT FOR DENTAL SERVICES FURNISHED TO MEDICAID RECIPIENTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND A

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Purpose. It is the purpose of [sections 1 through 5] to experiment with an alternative method for reimbursement of dental services under the medicaid program in order to determine whether dentist participation in the program can be enhanced, patient choice in health care options improved, and administrative costs reduced by not using a state fiscal agent. For this purpose, [section 2] establishes a pilot project, limited in time and area, that will use a system of vouchers for payment of dental services that a dentist may also use to claim an income tax credit, as provided in (section 6). It is intended that the pilot project be established only if approved by the secretary of the U.S. department of health

1 and human services.

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2 NEW SECTION. Section 2. Pilot project -- establishment 3 -- designation of project area. (1) The department of social and rehabilitation services shall establish a pilot project to provide reimbursement of dental services under the

medicaid program through the use of vouchers.

- (2) The project must be limited to a service delivery area consisting of not more than four contiguous counties that must include a mix of urban and rural areas. The service delivery area may coincide with the boundaries of a local district of dentists designated by the Montana dental association and based upon the willingness of dentists practicing in the area to participate in the project.

(3) Within the service delivery area, the department

shall issue vouchers for the payment of dental services

- 24 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Administration pilot
- 25 project -- issuance of vouchers. (1) An eligible person

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- residing in a service delivery area who wishes to receive 1 2 dental services under the medicaid program shall apply to 3 the department of social and rehabilitation services for a voucher. The application must include a statement from a dentist describing: 5
- 6 (a) the needed services or treatment; and

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- 7 (b) the usual and customary charge for the services or 8 treatment indicated.
 - (2) The department may approve an application for a voucher subject to the provisions of subsection (5). The department shall issue a voucher to an eligible person unless the dental service has already been provided under emergency circumstances. If dental services have already been provided under emergency circumstances, the department shall issue a voucher for approved services to the dentist who provided the service.
 - (3) The department shall issue vouchers in an amount equal to the full charge for services billed by the dentist unless the department determines that:
- 20 (a) the prevailing charge for the service in the project area is significantly less than the amount billed; 21 22 and
- 23 (b) the dentist is unable to document circumstances that would substantiate a higher charge. 24
- (4) If, pursuant to subsection (3), the department 25

- makes a determination that would require payment of less 2 than the full charge for services billed, the department shall issue a voucher based on the prevailing charge for the service in the project area.
- (5) In issuing vouchers for dental services, department shall allocate the total value of services approved each month for payment by voucher so as to ensure the availability of funding for the pilot project throughout 9 the calendar year. The department may also limit the total 10 value of dental services available to eligible persons 11 during the year.
- 13 of social and rehabilitation services shall request a waiver under section 1915 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 14 15 1396n) from the U.S. secretary of health and human services 16 for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of [sections 17 1 through 5].

NEW SECTION. Section 4. Federal waiver. The department

- NEW SECTION. Section 5. Report to the legislature. (1) 19 The department of social and rehabilitation services shall 20 actively monitor implementation of the pilot project.
- 21 (2) Not later than January 1, 1993, the department 22 shall submit a report to the 53rd legislature containing an 23 evaluation of the pilot project and recommending whether some or all of the policies tested under the project should 24 25 be continued.

- 1 NEW SECTION. Section 6. Tax credit. (1) There is a tax 2 credit against the tax imposed under this chapter allowable 3 to each taxpayer who is licensed to practice dentistry in 4 Montana in an amount equal to 60% of the value of vouchers 5 issued under [section 2] and accepted by the taxpayer as 6 full payment for dental services furnished by him during 7 calendar year 1992. 8 (2) The taxpayer is entitled to a tax refund to the 9 extent the tax credit allowed exceeds his tax liability.
- NEW SECTION. Section 7. Codification instruction. (1)
- 11 [Sections 1 through 5] are intended to be codified as an
- 12 integral part of Title 53, chapter 6, and the provisions of
- 13 Title 53, chapter 6, apply to [sections 1 through 5].
- 14 (2) [Section 6] is intended to be codified as an
- 15 integral part of Title 15, chapter 30, part 1, and the
- 16 provisions of Title 15, chapter 30, part 1, apply to
- 17 [section 6].
- NEW SECTION. Section 8. Effective date -- termination.
- 19 [This act] is effective July 1, 1991, and terminates July 1,
- 20 1993.

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB0233, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act establishing a pilot project to provide reimbursement of medicaid dental services through the use of vouchers; providing for administration of the pilot project; authorizing a tax credit for dentists who accept vouchers as payment for dental services furnished to medicaid recipients; and providing an effective date and a termination date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The act would require SRS to pay different rates of reimbursement to different dental providers for similar services.
- 2. The act would require dentists in a pilot project area to be paid manually, rather than through the state's medicaid fiscal intermediary, Consultec.
- 3. The act would not allow compliance with requirements of the Health Care Finance Administration (HCFA) of the federal Department of Health and Human Services relating to provision of information on possible fraud and abuse.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Not determined due to the technical note.

TECHNICAL OR MECHANICAL DEFECTS OR CONFLICTS WITH EXISTING LEGISLATION:

SRS has received information from HCFA on the proposed act which indicates that the act cannot be implemented in such a way as to comply with federal requirements.
