(3) (a) Each member or his designee who serves on the council pursuant to subsection (2)(a), er (2)(b), (2)(h), or (2)(i) of—this—section shall serve for a term concurrent with his respective term as a director or the superintendent of public instruction, as the case may be. Upon his removal from office, his or his designee's term as a member of the council is automatically terminated and his successor in office or his successor's designee is automatically a member of the council.

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- (b) Each member who serves on the council pursuant to subsection (2)(d) or (2)(e) of--this--section shall be appointed or reappointed annually by the governor.
- (c) Eight of the members serving on the council pursuant to subsection (2)(c), (2)(f), or (2)(g), (2)(j), or (3)(d) of-this-section shall be appointed by the governor to serve for terms concurrent with the gubernatorial term and until their successors are appointed. The remaining six members serving on the council pursuant to subsection (2)(c), (2)(f), (2)(g), (2)(j), or (3)(d) shall be appointed by the governor to serve for terms ending on January 1 of the third year of the succeeding gubernatorial term and until their successors are appointed.
