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Sinte BILL NO. 391 1 INTRODUCED BY 2 3 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO SPECIFICALLY APPLY 4 THE LAW REOUIRING A PREFERENCE FOR MONTANA PURCHASES TO THE 5 PROCUREMENT OF COMPUTER SYSTEMS AND SERVICES; AND AMENDING 6 7 SECTION 18-1-102, MCA." 8 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: Section 1. Section 18-1-102, MCA, is amended to read: 10 11 "18-1-102. State contracts to lowest resident bidder. (1) (a) In order to provide for an orderly administration of 12 13 the business of the state of Montana in awarding public contracts for the purchase of goods, the procurement of 14 15 computer systems and services, and for construction, repair, and public works of all kinds, a public agency shall award: 16 17 (i) a public contract for the procurement of computer 18 systems and services or for construction, repair, or public 19 works to the lowest responsible resident bidder whose bid 20 does not exceed the applicable percentage when compared to 21 the lowest responsible nonresident bidder. The applicable 22 percentage is the greater of: 23 (A) 3%; or

(B) the percentage that applies to a resident bidder inthe award of a public contract for construction, repair, or

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public works in the nonresident bidder's state of residence. l (ii) a public contract for the purchase of goods, if the 2 goods are comparable in quality and performance, to the 3 lowest responsible resident bidder whose: 4 (A) bid is not more than 3% higher than that of the 5 lowest responsible nonresident bidder; 6 (B) offered goods are Montana-made and whose bid is not 7 more than 5% higher than that of the lowest responsible 8 9 nonresident bidder; or (C) offered goods are Montana-made and whose bid is not 10 more than 3% higher than that of the lowest responsible 11 resident bidder whose offered goods are not Montana-made. 12 (b) (i) If both subsections (1)(a)(ii)(B) and 13 (l)(a)(ii)(C) are applicable to bids for a contract, the 14 contract must be awarded to the resident bidder whose 15 offered goods are Montana-made if the bid is: 16 (A) not more than 3% higher than that of a resident 17 bidder whose offered goods are not Montana-made; and 18 (B) not more than 5% higher than that of the 19 20 nonresident bidder. In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>SB0397</u>, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to specifically apply the law requiring a preference for Montana purchases to the procurement of computer systems and services; and amending section 18-1-102, MCA.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The proposed legislation adds the procurement of computer systems and services to the statute requiring the award of state contracts to the lowest resident bidder.
- 2. Current law requires the state to award a bid to a resident vendor if the resident vendor's bid is not more than 3% higher than the lowest responsible nonresident bidder.
- 3. Experience from prior bids indicates Montana vendors of computer systems and services are at least 10% higher than nonresident vendors.
- 4. The proposed legislation will not significantly impact current trends in the award of bids for goods and services.
