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STATEMENT OF INTENT

A statement of intent is not technically required for 14 this bill because the department of justice has authority 15 under 23-5-621 to adopt rules regarding the specifications 16 of video gambling machines. However, in enacting this bill, 17 it is the intent of the legislature that rules to be adopted 18 by the department regarding the specifications of video slot 19 machines follow as closely as possible the rules adopted 20 regarding the specifications of video draw poker machines 21 and video keno machines under 23-5-621 because it is further 22 the intent of the legislature to make conversion of existing 23 authorized video gambling machines to video slot machines as 24 simple and economical as possible. 25



2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 23-5-112, MCA, is amended to read:

4 "23-5-112. Definitions. Unless the context requires
5 otherwise, the following definitions apply to parts 1
6 through 6 of this chapter:

7 (1) "Applicant" means a person who has applied for a
8 license or permit issued by the department pursuant to parts
9 1 through 6 of this chapter.

10 (2) "Application" means a written request for a license
11 or permit issued by the department. The department shall
12 adopt rules describing the forms and information required
13 for issuance of a license.

14 (3) "Authorized equipment" means, with respect to live
15 keno or bingo, equipment that may be inspected by the
16 department and that randomly selects the numbers.

17 (4) "Bingo" means a gambling activity played for prizes 18 with a card bearing a printed design of 5 columns of 5 19 squares each, 25 squares in all. The letters B-I-N-G-O must 20 appear above the design, with each letter above one of the 21 columns. No more than 75 numbers may be used. One number 22 must appear in each square, except for the center square, 23 which may be considered a free play. Numbers are randomly 24 drawn using authorized equipment until the game is won by 25 person or persons who first cover a previously the

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designated arrangement of numbers on the bingo card. (5) "Bingo caller" means a person 18 years of age or older who, using authorized equipment, announces the order of the numbers drawn in live bingo. (6) "Card game table" or "table" means a live card game table authorized by permit and made available to the public on the premises of a licensed gambling operator. (7) "Dealer" means a person with a dealer's license issued under part 3 of this chapter. (8) "Department" means the department of justice. (9) "Distributor" means a person who: (a) purchases or obtains from another person equipment of any kind for use in gambling activities; and (b) sells, leases, or otherwise furnishes the equipment to another person for use in public. (10) "Gambling" or "gambling activity" means risking money, credit, deposit, check, property, or any other thing of value for a gain that is contingent in whole or in part upon lot, chance, or the operation of a gambling device or gambling enterprise. (11) "Gambling device" means а mechanical, electromechanical, or electronic device, machine, slot machine, video slot machine, instrument, apparatus, contrivance, scheme, or system used or intended for use in any gambling activity.

(12) "Gambling enterprise" means an activity, scheme, or

17 (17) "Keno caller" means a person 18 years of age or

19 of the numbers drawn in live keno.

(18) "License" means an operator's, dealer's, or
manufacturer-distributor's license issued to a person by the
department.

23 (19) "Licensee" means a person who has received a24 license from the department.

25 (20) "Live card game" or "card game" means a card game

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that is played in public between persons on the premises of
 a licensed gambling operator.

3 (21) "Lottery" or "gift enterprise" means a scheme, by whatever name known, for the disposal or distribution of 4 5 property by chance among persons who have paid or promised б to pay valuable consideration for the chance of obtaining 7 the property or a portion of it or for a share or interest 8 in the property upon an agreement, understanding, or expectation that it is to be distributed or disposed of by 9 lot or chance. However, "gift enterprise" does not mean: 10

11 (a) lotteries authorized under part 10 of this chapter; 12 or

13 (b) cash or merchandise attendance prizes or premiums 14 that the county fair commissioners of agricultural fairs and 15 rodeo associations may give away at public drawings at fairs 16 and rodeos.

17 (22) "Manufacturer" means a person who assembles from 18 raw materials or subparts a completed piece of equipment or 19 pieces of equipment of any kind to be used as a gambling 20 device.

(23) "Operator" means a person who purchases, receives,
or acquires, by lease or otherwise, and operates or controls
for use in public, a gambling device or gambling enterprise
authorized under parts 1 through 6 of this chapter.

25 (24) "Permit" means approval from the department to make

available for public play a gambling device or gambling
 enterprise approved by the department pursuant to parts 1
 through 6 of this chapter.

4 (25) "Person" or "persons" means both natural and
5 artificial persons and all partnerships, corporations,
6 associations, clubs, fraternal orders, and societies,
7 including religious and charitable organizations.

8 (26) "Premises" means the physical building or property
9 within or upon which a licensed gambling activity occurs, as
10 stated on an operator's license application and approved by
11 the department.

12 (27) "Public gambling" means gambling conducted in:

13 (a) a place, building, or conveyance to which the14 public has access or may be permitted to have access; or

(b) a place of public resort, including but not limited

16 to a facility owned, managed, or operated by a partnership,

17 corporation, association, club, fraternal order, or society,

18 including a religious or charitable organization.

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19 (28) "Raffle" means a gift enterprise in which each20 participant buys a chance or chances to win a prize.

(29) "Slot machine" means a mechanical, electrical, electronic, or other gambling device, contrivance, or machine that, upon insertion of a coin, currency, token, eredit card, or similar object or upon payment of any valuable consideration, is available to play or operate, the

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1 play or operation of which, whether by reason of the skill of the operator or application of the element of chance, or 2 both, may deliver or entitle the person playing or operating 3 4 the gambling device to receive cash, premiums, merchandise, tokens, or anything of value, whether the payoff is made 5 6 automatically from the machine or in any other manner. This 7 definition does not apply to video gambling machines, 8 including video slot machines, authorized under part 6 of 9 this chapter.

10 (30) "Video gambling machine" is a gambling device 11 specifically authorized by part 6 of this chapter and the 12 rules of the department."

13 Section 2. Section 23-5-602, MCA, is amended to read:
14 "23-5-602. Definitions. As used in this part, the
15 following definitions apply:

(1) "Associated equipment" means all proprietary
devices, machines, or parts used in the manufacture or
maintenance of a video gambling machine, including but not
limited to integrated circuit chips, printed wired assembly,
printed wired boards, printing mechanisms, video display
monitors, metering devices, and cabinetry.

(2) "Bingo machine" means an electronic video gambling
machine that, upon insertion of cash, is available to play
bingo as defined by rules of the department. The machine
utilizes a video display and microprocessors in which, by

the skill of the player, by chance, or both, the player may
 receive free games or credits that may be redeemed for cash.
 The term does not include a slot machine or a machine that
 directly dispenses coins, cash, tokens, or anything else of
 value.

6 (3) "Draw poker machine" means an electronic video 7 gambling machine that, upon insertion of cash, is available 8 to play or simulate the play of the game of draw poker as 9 defined by rules of the department. The machine utilizes a 10 video display and microprocessors in which, by the skill of 11 the player, by chance, or both, the player may receive free 12 games or credits that may be redeemed for cash. The term does not include a slot machine or a machine that directly 13 14 dispenses coins, cash, tokens, or anything else of value.

(4) "Keno machine" means an electronic video gambling 15 16 machine that, upon insertion of cash, is available to play 17 keno as defined by rules of the department. The machine utilizes a video display and microprocessors in which, by 18 19 the skill of the player, by chance, or both, the player may 20 receive free games or credits that may be redeemed for cash. 21 The term does not include a slot machine or a machine that 22 directly dispenses coins, cash, tokens, or anything else of 23 value.

(5) "Net machine income" means money put into a videogambling machine minus credits paid out in cash.

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(6) "Video gambling machine manufacturer-distributor"
 means a person who assembles, produces, makes, or supplies
 video gambling machines or associated equipment for sale,
 use, or distribution in the state.

5 (7) "Video slot machine" means an electronic video 6 gambling machine that, upon insertion of cash, is available 7 to play or simulate the play of a slot machine as defined by rules of the department. The machine uses a video display 8 9 and microprocessors in which the player, by chance, may 10 receive free games or credits that may be redeemed for cash. 11 The payoff from a video slot machine may not be made 12 automatically in cash but must be made in the same manner as 13 the payoff is made for a draw poker machine."

Section 3. Section 23-5-603, MCA, is amended to read:
"23-5-603. Video gambling machines -- possession --play -- restriction. (1) A person may make available for
public play only the number of approved video gambling
machines specifically authorized by this part.

19 (2) The video gambling machines specifically authorized 20 by this part are bingo, keno, and draw poker, and video slot 21 machines. Only the number of approved machines for which 22 permits have been granted under 23-5-612 may be made 23 available for play by the public on the premises of a 24 licensed operator. The department shall adopt rules allowing 25 a video gambling machine that needs repair to be temporarily

replaced while it is being repaired with a video gambling 1 machine that is approved under the permit provisions of this 2 part. A fee may not be charged for the replacement machine. 3 (3) Machines on premises licensed to sell alcoholic 4 beverages for consumption on the premises must be placed in 5 the room, area, or other part of the premises in which the 6 alcoholic beverages are sold and normally consumed." 7 Section 4. Section 23-5-608, MCA, is amended to read: B *23-5-608. Limitation on amount of money played and 9 value of prizes -- payment of credits in cash. Section 23-5-611, MCA, is amended to read: gualifications 20 "23-5-611. Machine permit limitations. (1) (a) A person who has been granted an 21 operator's license under 23-5-177 and a license to sell 22 alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises may be 23 24 granted a permit for the placement of video gambling

machines in his premises.

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(b) If video keno or bingo gambling machines were 1 2 legally operated on a premises on January 15, 1989, and the 3 premises were not on that date licensed to sell alcoholic 4 beverages for consumption on the premises or operated for 5 the principal purpose of gaming and there is an operator's 6 license for the premises under 23-5-177, a permit for the 7 same number of video keno or bingo gambling machines as were operated on the premises on that date may be granted to the 8 9 person who held the permit for such machines on those 10 premises on that date.

(c) A person who legally operated an establishment on January 15, 1989, for the principal purpose of gaming and has been granted an operator's license under 23-5-177 may be granted a permit for the placement of bingo and keno machines in his premises.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to legalize video slot machines under the Montana video gambling control law.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. As a result of this bill, there will be a net increase of 220 video machine permits.
- 2. Each new video machine will produce an average annual net income of \$11,000.
- 3. For regulatory purposes, the Gambling Control Division of the Department of Justice will require an additional 0.50 FTE machine tester (grade 15) along with additional operating and equipment expense.
- 4. Current law is represented by the executive budget base for the Gambling Control Division.
